- 1. - 2. As per Clause 4.15, Every student of a UG degree programme shall have to work on a project of 2 credits under the supervision of a faculty member or shall write a theory course based on Research Methodology as per the curriculum. But SDE/Private Registration students shall write the Research Methodology course instead of project. Board of Studies concerned shall prepare the syllabus for the same.
- 3. Accordingly, the meeting of the Board of Studies in Philosophy SB, vide paper read (3) above, has resolved to approve the syllabus of Research Methodology for SDE/Private registration BA Philosophy Programme, w.e.f 2019 admisson onwards.
- 4. The Dean, Faculty of Humanities has approved, vide paper read (4) above, the above decision of the Board of Studies in Philosophy (SB).
- 5. Considering the urgency, the Vice Chancellor has accorded sanction, vide paper read (5) above, to implement the syllabus of Research Methodology for SDE/Private registration BA Philosophy Programme in accordance with the new CBCSS UG Regulations 2019, in the University with effect from 2019 Admission onwards, subject to ratification by the Academic Council.
- 6. The syllabus of the theory course, Research Methodology in lieu of Project for SDE/Private registration BA Philosophy programme, in tune with the new CBCSS UG Regulations is therefore implemented with effect from 2019 Admission onwards, subject to ratification by the Academic Council
