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FOREWORD

Humans are blessed with the ability to look back at past events and ponder them. This 'hindsight', almost ironically, enables us to look ahead with better preparedness. As another year passes, individuals and institutions must turn back for a moment and count the footprints they have left behind. This annual report is precisely such an effort from our University.

The same hindsight tells us that the establishment of the University of Calicut in 1968 was a hugely significant moment in the history of erstwhile Malabar. This region, although very rich in natural and human resources, was left behind in development and education due to various historical reasons. The University, in the last 57 years, has not only brought about fundamental and longstanding upliftment in the higher education of the state, but also transformed the daily life of the people in the region. It is almost certain that every household in Malabar will have at least one individual who has built their life on the foundations of the education and training at the University.

This rich legacy and importance also pose serious challenges to the University. As advances in technology continue to disrupt every aspect of life, including ways for knowledge creation and dissemination, the University has strived hard to keep up. It has invested significantly in growing to meet the demands of the society around it. The major constituents of the University, affiliated colleges and research centres, have grown in number along with an increase in enrolled students. The quality of services provided by the University has also improved, bringing the stakeholders closer to its heart.

In 2025, the University made a quantum leap in infrastructural development. Major construction projects, such as the new academic block, multistoried hostel and sports pavilion, initiated under the MERU scheme of the PM USHA programme with a net grant of Rs. 100 Crore have progressed significantly on the campus. The modern, multistoried building for housing the advanced research equipment of the Central Sophisticated Instrumentation Facility (CSIF), built with funding from KIIFB, is nearing completion. The purchase of advanced research equipment for this facility, for nearly Rs. 60 Crore of KIIFB grant, is underway. The construction of the Golden Jubilee building, also under KIIFB, is almost complete.

The university has also made significant achievements in the academic and research fronts. The University has attained A+ Grade with CGPA of 3.45 in the fourth cycle (2022) NAAC accreditation. A major project worth Rs. 10 Crore by the Anusandhan National Research Foundation (ANRF) was awarded to the University under the newly launched mega scheme 'PAIR.' The University has partnered with the Indian Institute of Science (IISc) Bangalore and six other Institutes all over the country in this scheme. Students and faculty members of the University continue to bring laurels in academic, research, sports, arts and other fronts. The alumni of our University, spread all over the globe, have also made marks in the chosen fields of activity.

Despite the substantial progress we have achieved, the rapidly evolving landscape of higher education demands that we remain proactive, responsive, and resilient. State universities in particular are likely to face significant academic and fiscal challenges in the years ahead, and our ability to anticipate and adapt will determine our continued success.

As we move forward, let us commit ourselves to addressing our shortcomings, leveraging our collective strengths, and relentlessly pursuing excellence in teaching, research, and public service. Through shared vision and sustained effort, we can ensure that our institution continues to grow in stature and impact.

It is with immense happiness and a renewed sense of responsibility that I present the Annual Report for the year 2025. I trust that this report will serve not only as a record of our achievements, but also as a source of inspiration, earning a lasting place both on your bookshelf and in your memory.

2025: സുസ്ഥിര മികവിന്റെ വർഷം

കേരളത്തിലെ ഏറ്റവും വലിയ സർവകലാശാലയാണ് കാലിക്കറ്റ് സർവകലാശാല. 1968-ൽ സ്ഥാപിതമായ, കേരളത്തിലെ ഇത്തരത്തിലുള്ള രണ്ടാമത്തെ സർവകലാശാലയായ കാലിക്കറ്റ്, വടക്കൻകേരളത്തിന്റെ, വിശേഷിച്ച് മലബാർ മേഖലയുടെ വിദ്യാഭ്യാസപരവും സാംസ്കാരികവുമായ ഉന്നമനത്തിൽ നിർണായകമായ പങ്ക് വഹിച്ചിട്ടുണ്ട്. 'നിർമ്മായ കർമ്മണാ ശ്രീ' (കളങ്കമില്ലാത്ത, മായമില്ലാത്ത കർമ്മങ്ങൾ ശ്രേയസ്സുണ്ടാക്കുന്നു എന്ന് മലയാളത്തിൽ ഏതാണ്ട് വിവർത്തനം ചെയ്യാം) എന്ന മുദ്രാവാക്യത്താൽ നയിക്കപ്പെടുന്ന ഈ സർവകലാശാല ചുറ്റുമുള്ള പ്രദേശത്തിന്റെയും എണ്ണമറ്റ വ്യക്തികളുടെയും ജീവിതത്തെ പല മട്ടിൽ ക്രമികമായി മാറ്റിത്തീർത്തിട്ടുണ്ട്. ഇന്ന്, 37 ഓൺ കാമ്പസ് അധ്യാപന വകുപ്പുകളിലൂടെയും 443 അഫിലിയേറ്റഡ് കോളേജുകളിലൂടെയും അഞ്ച് ജില്ലകളിലെ ജനങ്ങൾക്ക് സർവകലാശാല സേവനം നൽകുന്നു. അരനൂറ്റാണ്ട് എന്നത് ഒരു സർവകലാശാലയെ സംബന്ധിച്ച് ആയുസ്സിലെ ഒരു ചെറിയ കാലയളവാണെങ്കിലും, ഇതിനകംതന്നെ കാലിക്കറ്റ് സർവകലാശാല സമ്പന്നമായ ഒരു പാരമ്പര്യം സൃഷ്ടിക്കുകയും മലബാർമേഖലയിലെ ഏറ്റവും സ്വാധീനമുള്ള ആധുനികസ്ഥാപനം എന്ന ബഹുമതിനേടുകയും ചെയ്തിട്ടുണ്ട്. കേരളത്തിലെ അക്കാദമിക്, സാമൂഹിക-സാംസ്കാരികമേഖലയിലെ പ്രഗല്ഭരുടെ തട്ടകമായിരുന്നു സർവകലാശാലാ കാമ്പസ് - പ്രൊഫ. സുകുമാർ അഴീക്കോട്, പ്രൊഫ. എം. ജി. എസ്. നാരായണൻ, പ്രൊഫ. കെ. ജി. അടിയോടി, പ്രൊഫ. കെ. എസ്. മണിലാൽ തുടങ്ങിയവർ ഇവരിൽ ചിലർ മാത്രം. ഈ പട്ടികയെന്നപോലെ, സമൂഹത്തിന് സർവകലാശാല നൽകിവരുന്ന സംഭാവനകളും ക്രമാനുഗതമായി വളർന്നുകൊണ്ടിരിക്കുകയാണ്. 2025- വർഷവും ഇതിൽനിന്ന് വ്യത്യസ്തമല്ല. അക്കാദമിക്, സാമൂഹിക- സാംസ്കാരിക മേഖലകളിൽ സർവകലാശാല ഉയർന്നുതന്നെ നിൽക്കുന്നു. പോയ വർഷത്തെ നമ്മുടെ സംഭാവനകളും നേട്ടങ്ങളും ചുരുക്കി വിവരിക്കാം.

വിദ്യാർത്ഥികൾക്ക് ഡ്യൂവൽ-ഡിഗ്രി ഓപ്ഷൻ വാഗ്ദാനം ചെയ്യുന്ന കേരളത്തിലെ ആദ്യത്തെ സർവകലാശാലയായി കാലിക്കറ്റ് സർവകലാശാല മാറി. 2025-ൽ, സംസ്ഥാന ഉന്നതവിദ്യാഭ്യാസവകുപ്പും സംസ്ഥാനതല ക്വാളിറ്റി അഷ്വറൻസ് സെല്ലും സംയുക്തമായി സംഘടിപ്പിച്ച ചടങ്ങിൽ, ദേശീയ തലത്തിൽ മികവ് പ്രകടിപ്പിച്ച ഉന്നത വിദ്യാഭ്യാസ സ്ഥാപനങ്ങൾക്കായി ഏർപ്പെടുത്തിയ മിനിസ്റ്റേഴ്സ് അവാർഡ് ഫോർ എക്സലൻസ് സർവകലാശാലയ്ക്ക് ലഭിച്ചു. NIRF 2025-ൽ, ഇന്ത്യൻ സർവകലാശാലകൾക്കിടയിൽ സർവകലാശാല 101-150 റാങ്ക് ബാൻഡിലും സംസ്ഥാന സർവകലാശാല വിഭാഗത്തിൽ 38-ആം സ്ഥാനത്തും നിൽക്കുന്നു. നാലാം സൈക്കിൾ (2022) NAAC അക്രഡിറ്റേഷനിൽ 3.45 CGPA യോടെ സർവകലാശാല A+ ഗ്രേഡ് നേടി. പരീക്ഷ കഴിഞ്ഞ് 21 പ്രവൃത്തി ദിവസങ്ങൾക്കുള്ളിൽ 2025-ലെ ബിരുദ പരീക്ഷകളുടെ ഫലങ്ങൾ സർവകലാശാല പ്രസിദ്ധീകരിച്ചു, കോളേജുകളുടെയും വിദ്യാർത്ഥികളുടെയും എണ്ണം കണക്കിലെടുക്കുമ്പോൾ ഇത് ഒരു ശ്രദ്ധേയമായ നേട്ടമാണ്. 2025-ൽ ബിരുദം നേടിയ വിദ്യാർത്ഥികളുടെ ആവേശകരമായ പങ്കാളിത്തത്തോടെ പാലക്കാട്, തൃശ്ശൂർ, വയനാട്, മലപ്പുറം, കോഴിക്കോട് എന്നീ അഞ്ച് ജില്ലകളിലേയും ഔദ്യോഗിക ബിരുദദാനച്ചടങ്ങുകൾ നടന്നു.

കഴിഞ്ഞ വർഷം സർവകലാശാലയുടെ ഗവേഷണപ്രവർത്തനങ്ങളിൽ വലിയതോതിലുള്ള വളർച്ചയുണ്ടായി. വളരെ പ്രശസ്തമായ അന്താരാഷ്ട്ര സയൻസ് ജേർണലുകളിൽ നിരവധി പ്രബന്ധങ്ങൾ പ്രസിദ്ധീകരിക്കാൻ നമ്മുടെ ഗവേഷകർക്ക് കഴിഞ്ഞു. 2025-ൽ സർവകലാശാലയ്ക്ക് ഒരു പേറ്റന്റ് ലഭിച്ചു, അഞ്ച് പേറ്റന്റ് അപേക്ഷകൾ ഫയൽചെയ്തു. ഗവേഷണനടത്തിപ്പിനായി

നമ്മുടെ ഗവേഷകർ പുറമേനിന്ന് വലിയതോതിൽ ഗ്രാന്റുകളും കൊണ്ടുവന്നിട്ടുണ്ട്. അനുസന്ധാൻ നാഷണൽ റിസർച്ച് ഫൗണ്ടേഷന്റെ (ANRF) പുതുതായി ആരംഭിച്ച ഫളാഗ്ഷിപ്പ് പ്രോഗ്രാം 'PAIR' പ്രകാരം എല്ലാ അപേക്ഷകരിലും വച്ച് ഏറ്റവും വലിയ ഗ്രാന്റ് നേടുന്നതിന് സർവകലാശാല IISc ബാംഗ്ലൂരുമായും മറ്റ് ആറ് സ്ഥാപനങ്ങളുമായും സഹകരിച്ചു പ്രവർത്തിച്ചു. ANRF-PAIR പദ്ധതി പ്രകാരം സർവകലാശാലയ്ക്ക് 8.64 കോടി രൂപ മുതൽ ഗ്രാന്റ് ലഭിച്ചു. നമ്മുടെ പല പഠനവകുപ്പുകളും അവർ ഭാഗമായിട്ടുള്ള വിവിധ ബഹു-സ്ഥാപന സഹകരണ പദ്ധതികൾക്ക് ഗണ്യമായ സംഭാവനകൾ നൽകി. ഇവ കൂടാതെ ANRF, DST, IAE, DBT, KSCSTE തുടങ്ങിയ ഏജൻസികളിൽ നിന്ന് വ്യക്തികേന്ദ്രിത ഫണ്ട് നേടാനും നമ്മുടെ നിരവധി ഫാക്കൽറ്റി അംഗങ്ങൾക്ക് സാധിച്ചു.

വലിയതോതിലുള്ള, അത്യാധുനിക സൗകര്യങ്ങളുള്ള നിർമ്മിതികളിലൂടെ സർവകലാശാല കാമ്പസ് മാറുകയാണ്. ഇതിൽ, PM ഉഷാ പദ്ധതി പ്രകാരം 100 കോടി രൂപ ഗ്രാന്റിൽ ഒരു പുതിയ അക്കാദമിക് ബ്ലോക്ക് (27 കോടി രൂപ), ഒരു ബഹുനില ഹോസ്റ്റൽ (15 കോടി രൂപ), ഒരു സ്പോർട്സ് പവലിയൻ (5 കോടി രൂപ) എന്നിവ ഉൾപ്പെടുന്നു. നമ്മുടെ സ്ഥാപനത്തെ ഒരു മൾട്ടി-ഡിസിപ്ലിനറി എഡ്യൂക്കേഷണൽ ആൻഡ് റിസർച്ച് യൂണിവേഴ്സിറ്റി (MERU) ആക്കി ഉയർത്തുക എന്നതാണ് ലക്ഷ്യം. കൂടാതെ, KIIFB ധനസഹായത്തോടെ ഒരു ആധുനിക സെൻട്രൽ സോഫിസ്റ്റിക്കേറ്റഡ് ഇൻസ്ട്രുമെന്റേഷൻ ഫെസിലിറ്റി (CSIF), ഗോൾഡൻജൂബിലി പരീക്ഷാകേന്ദ്രം (ആകെ 102.67 കോടി രൂപ) എന്നിവയുടെ നിർമ്മാണം പൂർത്തിയായിക്കൊണ്ടിരിക്കുകയാണ്. കിഫ്ബിയുടെ സഹായത്തോടെ ഹോസ്റ്റലുകൾ (30 കോടി രൂപ), ഒരു വിവർത്തനഗവേഷണകേന്ദ്രം (20 കോടി രൂപ) എന്നിവയും നിർമ്മിക്കുന്നു.

അക്കാദമിക്, ഗവേഷണ സഹകരണത്തിനായി ദേശീയ, അന്തർദേശീയ സ്ഥാപനങ്ങളുമായി ശക്തമായ ബന്ധം സ്ഥാപിക്കാനും സർവകലാശാലയ്ക്ക് കഴിഞ്ഞു. യൂണിവേഴ്സിറ്റി ഓഫ് ആർട്സ് ലണ്ടൻ-വിംബിൾഡൻ, ശ്രീലങ്കയിലെ ജാഫ്ന യൂണിവേഴ്സിറ്റി, പോളണ്ടിലെ വാർസോയിലുള്ള അലക്സാണ്ടർ സെൽവെറോവിച്ച്സ് നാഷണൽ അക്കാദമി ഓഫ് ഡ്രമാറ്റിക് ആർട്ട് എന്നീ മൂന്ന് വിദേശ സർവകലാശാലകളുമായി അക്കാദമിക് സഹകരണത്തിനായി സ്കൂൾ ഓഫ് ഡ്രാമ ആൻഡ് ഫൈൻ ആർട്സ് ധാരണാപത്രങ്ങളിൽ ഒപ്പുവച്ചു. ഗവേഷണ സഹകരണത്തിനും വിദ്യാർത്ഥി-അധ്യാപക വിനിമയത്തിനുമുള്ള ഒരു ധാരണാപത്രത്തിൽ ഹൈദരാബാദിലെ സിഎസ്ഐആർ-ഇന്ത്യൻ ഇൻസ്റ്റിറ്റ്യൂട്ട് ഓഫ് കെമിക്കൽ ടെക്നോളജി (CSIR-IIT) ഒപ്പുവച്ചു. ആയുഷ് മന്ത്രാലയത്തിന് കീഴിലുള്ള NIIMH ഹൈദരാബാദുമായി സഹകരിച്ച് സർവകലാശാല, തുഞ്ചൻ മാനുസ്ക്രിപ്റ്റ് റിപ്പോസിറ്ററി ആൻഡ് മൾട്ടിഡിസിപ്ലിനറി റിസർച്ച് സെന്ററിൽ നിന്നുള്ള 477 ആയുർവേദ താളിയോല കയ്യെഴുത്തുപ്രതികൾ ഡിജിറ്റൈസ് ചെയ്തു. സെന്റർ ഫോർ ഇന്നൊവേഷൻ ആൻഡ് എന്റർപ്രണർഷിപ്പ് അഞ്ച് ഇൻകുബേറ്റഡ് സ്റ്റാർട്ടപ്പുകളെ സ്വകാര്യ ലിമിറ്റഡ് കമ്പനികളായി രജിസ്റ്റർ ചെയ്യുകയും കേരള സ്റ്റാർട്ട്-അപ്പ് മിഷനുമായി സഹകരിച്ച് സർവകലാശാലയിൽ ഒരു LEAP പ്ലാറ്റ്ഫോം സ്ഥാപിക്കുകയും ചെയ്തു.

2025 വർഷം, സർവകലാശാലയുടെ കായികവിഭാഗത്തിനും അവിസ്മരണീയമായിരുന്നു. രാജസ്ഥാനിൽ നടന്ന ഖേലോ ഇന്ത്യ യൂണിവേഴ്സിറ്റി ഗെയിംസിൽ, പുരുഷ ഫുട്ബോൾ, പുരുഷ വോളിബോൾ മത്സരങ്ങളിൽ യൂണിവേഴ്സിറ്റി സ്വർണ്ണ മെഡലുകൾ നേടി. കൂടാതെ, യൂണിവേഴ്സിറ്റി ടീം തുടർച്ചയായി നാലാം തവണയും അഖിലേന്ത്യാ ഇന്റർ യൂണിവേഴ്സിറ്റി വനിതാ ബേസ് ബോൾ ചാമ്പ്യൻഷിപ്പ് നേടി.

മയക്കുമരുന്ന് ഭീഷണിയെ ചെറുക്കുന്നതിൽ യൂണിവേഴ്സിറ്റി നേതൃപരമായ പങ്ക് വഹിച്ചു. 2025 മാർച്ച് 22 ന് ചേർന്ന യൂണിവേഴ്സിറ്റി സെനറ്റ് യോഗത്തിൽ ബഹുമാനപ്പെട്ട ചാൻസലർ ശ്രീ. രാജേന്ദ്ര വിശ്വനാഥ് ആർലേക്കർ മയക്കുമരുന്ന് ദുരുപയോഗത്തിനെതിരായ സംസ്ഥാനവ്യാപകമായ ഒരു കാമ്പയിൻ ഉദ്ഘാടനം ചെയ്തു. സെനറ്റ് അംഗങ്ങളെ അഭിസംബോധന ചെയ്തുകൊണ്ട് സംസാരിച്ച ബഹുമാനപ്പെട്ട ചാൻസലർ, ക്യാമ്പസിൽ മയക്കുമരുന്നിനോട് ഒരു വിട്ടുവീഴ്ചയും കാണിക്കില്ല എന്ന് പ്രഖ്യാപിച്ചു. ലഹരിവസ്തുക്കളുടെ ഉപയോഗത്തിൽ നിന്ന് യുവാക്കളെ

സംരക്ഷിക്കുന്നതിന് കൂട്ടായ ശ്രമം വേണമെന്ന് അദ്ദേഹം ഊന്നിപ്പറഞ്ഞു.

കാലിക്കറ്റ് യൂണിവേഴ്സിറ്റി അഫിലിയേറ്റഡ് കോളേജുകളിലെ അധ്യാപകർക്കായി ഏർപ്പെടുത്തിയ പ്രൊഫസർ എം എം ഗനി അവാർഡ്, തൃശ്ശൂർ വിമല കോളേജ് പ്രിൻസിപ്പൽ സിസ്റ്റർ ഡോ. ബീന ജോസിനും ചുങ്കത്തറ മാർത്തോമ്മ കോളേജിലെ പ്രൊഫ. (ഡോ.) എം.ബി. ഗോപാലകൃഷ്ണനും സമ്മാനിച്ചു. 2025 ജനുവരിയിൽ നടത്തിയ മൂന്ന് ദിവസത്തെ ശാസ്ത്രയാൻ ഓപ്പൺ-ഹൗസ് പരിപാടി ആയിരക്കണക്കിന് ആവേശഭരിതരായ സന്ദർശകർക്ക് മുന്നിൽ, പ്രധാനമായും യുവവിദ്യാർത്ഥികൾക്ക് മുന്നിൽ, അവബോധം സൃഷ്ടിക്കാനുതകുന്ന പരീക്ഷണങ്ങളും ഇൻസ്റ്റലേഷനുകളും പ്രദർശിപ്പിച്ചു. ചീമേനി ഓപ്പൺ ജയിൽ, കോഴിക്കോട് സൈബർ ക്രൈം പോലീസ് സ്റ്റേഷൻ എന്നിവയുമായി സഹകരിച്ച് സർവകലാശാല ക്ലിനിക്കൽ നിയമവിദ്യാഭ്യാസസ്ഥാപനം ആരംഭിക്കുകയും നിയമസഹായവും വിദഗ്ദ്ധപരിശീലനവും നൽകുകയും ചെയ്തു. വിമൻസ് സ്റ്റഡീസ് പഠന വകുപ്പ് സംസ്ഥാന ആസൂത്രണബോർഡിന്റെ ധനസഹായത്തോടെ സംഘടിപ്പിച്ച അംഗൻവാടി ജീവനക്കാർക്കുള്ള ശേഷിവികസന കോഴ്സ്, NEP 2020 വിഭാവനംചെയ്ത മട്ടിലുള്ള പ്രവർത്തനമായിരുന്നു. വിദ്യാർത്ഥികൾക്കും പൊതുജനങ്ങൾക്കുമുള്ള കളരിപ്പയറ്റ് പരിശീലനവും വേനൽക്കാല കായികപരിശീലന ക്യാമ്പുകളും സർവകലാശാലയുടെ സാമൂഹികമായ ഇടപെടലുകളെ സമ്പന്നമാക്കി. ഫോറൻസിക് സയൻസ് വകുപ്പ് കേരള പോലീസ് അക്കാദമിയുമായി സഹകരിച്ച് പ്രൊഫഷണൽ ഡോൾ ട്രെയിനിംഗ്, കെനെൻ ഫോറൻസിക്സ് എന്നിവയിൽ ഒരു സർട്ടിഫിക്കറ്റ് കോഴ്സ് ആരംഭിച്ചു. ഇത് നിയമനിർവ്വഹണപ്രക്രിയയുമായി ഫോറൻസിക് സയൻസിനെ സംയോജിപ്പിക്കുന്ന രാജ്യത്തെ ആദ്യത്തെ സർവകലാശാലാ തലത്തിലുള്ള നൈപുണ്യ-അധിഷ്ഠിത പ്രോഗ്രാമുകളിൽ ഒന്നാണ്.

2025 ലെ പ്രധാന നേട്ടങ്ങളെക്കുറിച്ചുള്ള ഈ ഹ്രസ്വാവലോകനം സർവകലാശാലയുടെ പ്രവർത്തനങ്ങളുടെയും അതിന്റെ സ്വാധീനതയുടെയും ഒരു വിഹഗവീക്ഷണം മാത്രമേ ആവുന്നുള്ളൂ. ഈ വാർഷിക റിപ്പോർട്ടിന്റെ തുടർന്നുള്ള പേജുകളിൽ വരുന്ന വിശദാംശങ്ങളിലേക്ക് വായനക്കാരെ സ്നേഹപൂർവ്വം ക്ഷണിക്കുന്നു.

INTRODUCTION

2025: A YEAR OF SUSTAINED EXCELLENCE

University of Calicut is the largest University in Kerala. Established in 1968, as only the second of its kind in Kerala, the University has played a pivotal role in the educational and cultural upliftment of the Malabar region of Northern Kerala. Guided by the motto *“Nirmaya Karmaṇa Sree”* (loosely translatable as “Prosperity through Pure Action”) the University has steadily transformed the lives of countless individuals and the region around it in many ways. Today, the University caters to the population of five districts, through its 37 on-campus teaching departments and 443 affiliated colleges. Although half a century is a short period in the lifetime of a University, it has already created a rich legacy and earned the distinction of being arguably the most influential modern institution in the Malabar region. The University campus has been home to a number of towering personalities in the academic and socio-cultural landscape of Kerala; Prof. Sukumar Azheekode, Prof. M. G. S. Narayanan, Prof. K. G. Adiyodi and Prof. K. S. Manilal, to name a few. This list and the University’s contributions to the society have been steadily growing. The year 2025 has been no exception, and the University continues to stand tall in academic as well as socio-cultural arenas. The following are some of such achievements and contributions of the University in 2025.

University of Calicut became the first university in Kerala to offer the dual-degree option to students. In 2025, the University received the **Minister’s Award for Excellence**, instituted for higher education institutions that have demonstrated excellence at the national level, in a ceremony jointly organised by the State Higher Education Department and State Level Quality Assurance Cell of Kerala. In the **NIRF 2025**, the University stands in the 101-150 rank band among Indian Universities and 38th position in the State University category. The University has also attained **A+ Grade** with CGPA of **3.45** in the fourth cycle (2022) **NAAC** accreditation. The results of the Undergraduate examinations in 2025 were published by the University within 21 working days after the examination, a remarkable feat considering the large number of colleges and students. Formal graduation ceremonies were conducted in all the five districts covered by the University: Palakkad, Thrissur, Wayanad, Malappuram and Kozhikode, with excellent and enthusiastic participation from students who graduated in 2025.

Last year witnessed tremendous growth in the research activities of the University. Our researchers have broken through to publish multiple papers in highly reputed international journals in Science. A patent was granted to the University and five patent applications were filed in 2025. Our researchers have also brought in large external grants for the conduct of research. University partnered with IISc Bangalore and six other institutions to secure the largest grant among all applicants under the newly launched flagship programme ‘PAIR’ of the Anusandhan National Research Foundation (ANRF). The University received a grant of ₹ 8.64 crores under the ANRF-PAIR project. Many of our departments made significant contributions to the various ongoing multi-institutional collaborative projects that they are part of. In addition to these, a number of our faculty members were successful in securing individual-centric funds from agencies such as ANRF, DST, IAE, DBT and KSCSTE.

The University campus is being transformed through the construction of large-scale, state-of-the-art facilities. These include, a new academic block (₹ 27 crore), a multi-storied hostel (₹ 15 crore) and a sport pavilion (₹ 5 crore) under the PM USHA scheme with a total grant of ₹ 100 crore, aimed at elevating the institution into a Multi-Disciplinary Educational and Research University (**MERU**). In addition, the construction of a modern Central Sophisticated Instrumentation Facility (CSIF) and the Golden Jubilee Examination Centre (Total ₹ 102.67 crore) funded by **KIIFB** are nearing completion. Hostels (₹ 30 crore), and a Translational Research Centre (₹ 20 crore) are also being built with the help of funds from **KIIFB**.

The University has also forged strong associations with National and International institutes for academic and research co-operation. School of Drama and Fine Arts has signed MoUs with three foreign

universities viz. University of Arts London-Wimbledon, University of Jaffna- Sri Lanka and Aleksander Zelwerowicz National Academy of Dramatic Art in Warsaw, Poland, for academic collaboration. An MoU for research collaboration, student and faculty exchange was signed with the CSIR-Indian Institute of Chemical Technology (CSIR-IICT) Hyderabad. The University, in collaboration with NIIMH Hyderabad under the Ministry of AYUSH, digitised 477 Ayurveda palm leaf manuscripts from the Tunjan Manuscript Repository and Multidisciplinary Research Centre. The Centre for Innovation and Entrepreneurship registered five incubated start-ups as private limited companies and partnered with Kerala Start-up Mission to establish a LEAP platform at the University.

The year 2025 was also memorable for the University's sports excellence. At the ***Khelo India*** University Games held in Rajasthan, the University won gold medals in the Men's Football and the Men's Volleyball competitions. In addition, the University Team won the All-India Inter-University Women's Base Ball Championship for the fourth **consecutive** time.

The University also took a lead role in combating the drug menace. **Sri. Rajendra Viswanath Arlekar**, the Hon'ble Chancellor of the University inaugurated a statewide campaign against the abuse of drugs in the meeting of the Senate of the University convened on 22.03.2025. Addressing the members of the Senate, the Hon'ble Chancellor declared zero tolerance to drugs on campus. He stressed the need for a united effort to safeguard the youth against the substance abuse.

Professor Ghani Award, instituted by the University of Calicut for the teachers in affiliated colleges, was presented to Sr. Dr. Beena Jose, Principal of Vimala College, Thrissur, and Prof. (Dr.) M. B. Gopalakrishnan of Mar Thoma College, Chungathara. The three-day Shastrayan Open-house Programme conducted in January 2025 showcased awe-inspiring and awareness-creating experiments and installations in front of thousands of enthusiastic visitors, mostly young students. The University institutionalised Clinical Legal Education through collaborations with Open Prison *Cheemeni* and Cyber Crime Police Station Kozhikode, providing legal aid and expert training. A Capacity Development Course for *Anganwadi* Workers, organised by the Department of Women's Studies and funded by the State Planning Board has strengthened competencies aligned with NEP 2020. *Kalaripayattu* training and Summer Sports Coaching Camps offered to the students and public enriched the university's community engagement. The Department of Forensic Science launched a pioneering Certificate Course in Professional Dog Training and Canine Forensics in collaboration with Kerala Police Academy, which constitutes one of the country's first university-level skill-oriented programmes integrating forensic science with law enforcement practices.

This short overview of the major events of 2025 captures only a glimpse of the University's activities and its impact. The reader is invited to browse the details in the ensuing pages of this Annual Report of the year 2025.

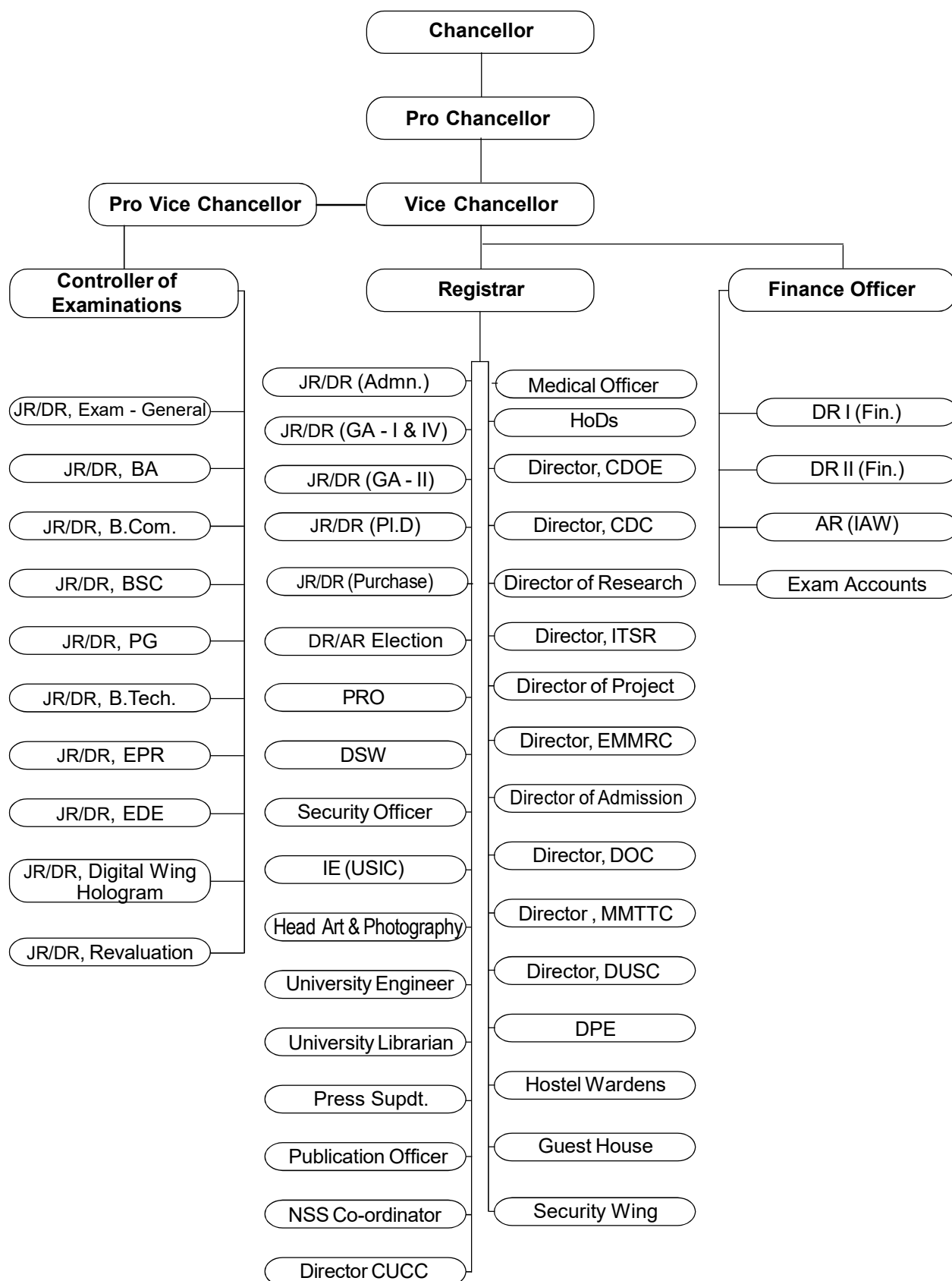

Brief note on the works:			

Art & Photography unit established in 1982 as a centralized unit for the artistic and photographic work of the University of Calicut, which is placed within the Department of Botany since its inception. Currently working in the lower room of the senate house

The major objectives of this unit are to carry out the artistic and photographic work related to the academic and non-academic area and to cover important events of the University. The research wing of the University especially the science departments frequently utilize the technical assistance from this unit for the photographic documentation of their research work and also for creating scientific drawings. All the work is being carried out on request with proper intent forwarded by the head of the divisions.

Sri.Dr.CC Harilal, of this unit acting as Head in-charge of the Art & Photography. In addition to head, the other staff, who are working in this unit, are One Photographer

The team, in close consultation with Departments and officers of the concerned programme committees of the university, has worked to cover all the functions and programmes conducted during the year. Documented the photographs systematically and submitted the soft copies to the concerned authorities and a copy of the same to the office of the Hon. Vice-Chancellor for kind perusal.

Most of the academic work came from the Science Departments of the University of Calicut. The work involves outdoor and indoor photography, preparation of photographs, microphotographs, photomicrographs etc. The artistic works mainly concentrated in the area of book cover designs, graphic representations, preparation of charts, scientific diagrams, tabular data and resource map preparations. Indoor and outdoor work for the researchers in various Departments was also carried out by our photographers on request.

Research scholars of various Departments approach this division for the photographic work and preparation of plates for thesis. All the photographic works undertaken in this Department are well documented with all particulars in a separate register, which are available for future reference if required. Preparation of scientific drawings and plates for the thesis of Ph.D., M.Phil. and M.Sc. students are also being carried out in this unit.

Another objective of our unit is to undertake the outdoor photographic works of various functions organized by the Departments and University. These photographs have been processed, documented and issued to the authorities at the earliest after every function. Copies of the photographs have been submitted simultaneously to the public relations officer of the University for Press Release. Copies of digital photos stored in CDs are being maintained after making entry in the register. The functions organized in connection with the retirement of teaching and non-teaching staff of the University are also covered and a copy of the photographs will be presented to the concerned section.

During the year 2025, this unit issued 8754 nos. of Scientific and general photographs, Cover designs for Annual Reports and drawings in connection with the research works and other events of the University.

The activities of the various sections of the library are given below:

1. ACQUISITION SECTION

The section is mainly concerned with purchase of books. Purchases are made from the fund allotted by the State Government under State Plan Grant. Also, funds from UGC, if any, allotted are made use for purchase of books.

During the financial year **2024-2025, Rs.12,00,000/-** was allotted under State Plan Grant. The allotted amount is fully utilized for purchase of books. Total number of titles added to the library collection during the year is **1164**. In addition to this, a number of **61** books were also added to the library as free gift. All these documents are entered in the concerned registers and entries related to this section are made in the KOHA software.

2) TECHNICAL SECTION

The Technical Section of CHMK Library is devoted to processing of books received from Acquisition section either purchased or gift books.

Major activities are :

- Classifying the books according to the latest edition of Dewey Decimal Classification Scheme which is an internationally accepted scheme of classification.
- Cataloguing the books according to AACR II.
- Databases of the newly acquired books in the international standard format using KOHA Open Source Library System.
- Creating Subject heading using Searls list of Subject heading.
- Display of new books in every 15 days.

7) DIGITAL LIBRARY

Digital Library Section is responsible for acquisition, maintenance and provision of digital resources, offering Orientation and Training programmes to the user community. Digitization of PhD theses and uploading the theses to the National ETD Repository "Shodhganga". 320 theses were added to the national ETD repository Shodhganga. During the year the section maintained its access to the ebook collection of ProQuest ebook Central, Cambridge Books Online, Oxford Scholarship Online and many other free open source ebook contents.

The electronic journal collection includes 13000+ e-journals from 30 publishers under One Nation One Subscription scheme (ONOS) scheme of Government of India. Apart from this the library subscribes 3500+ e-journals from various publishers. The library subscribes to Indiastat statistical database, Manupatra Legal database and Web of Science a bibliographic database. National ETD repository Shodhganga is also widely used. Several orientation sessions were conducted for the academic community for accessing and using the e-resources of various publishers.

The digital library maintains the IRINS (Indian Research Information Network System) The profiles of faculty and scholars are added and updated regularly. The usage statistics of various resources are also monitored by the digital library.

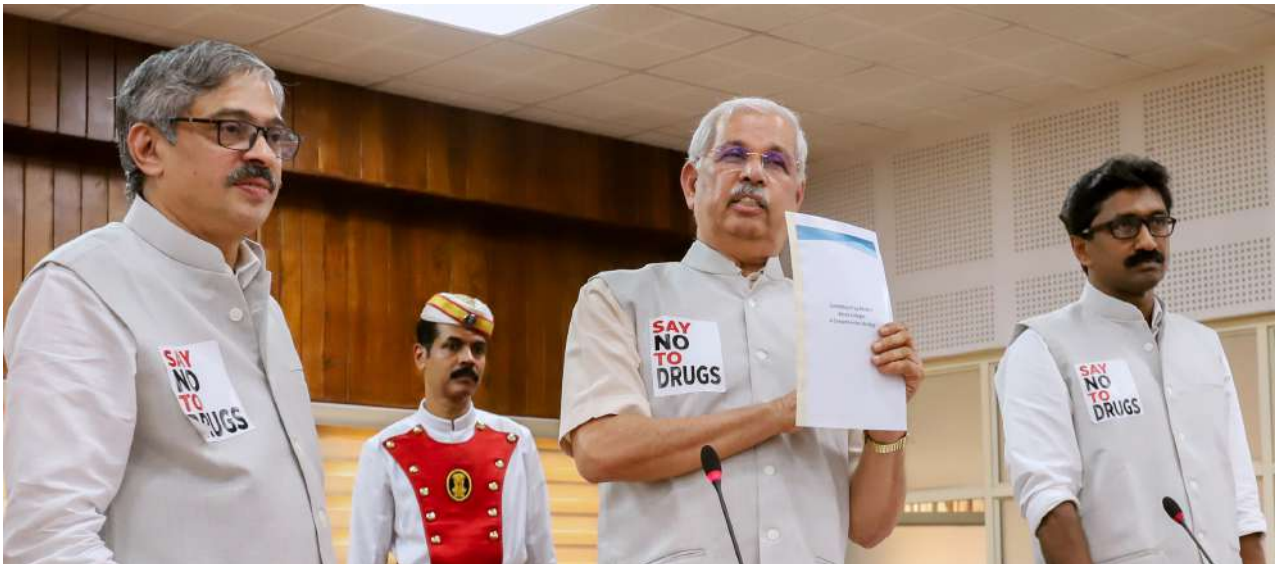

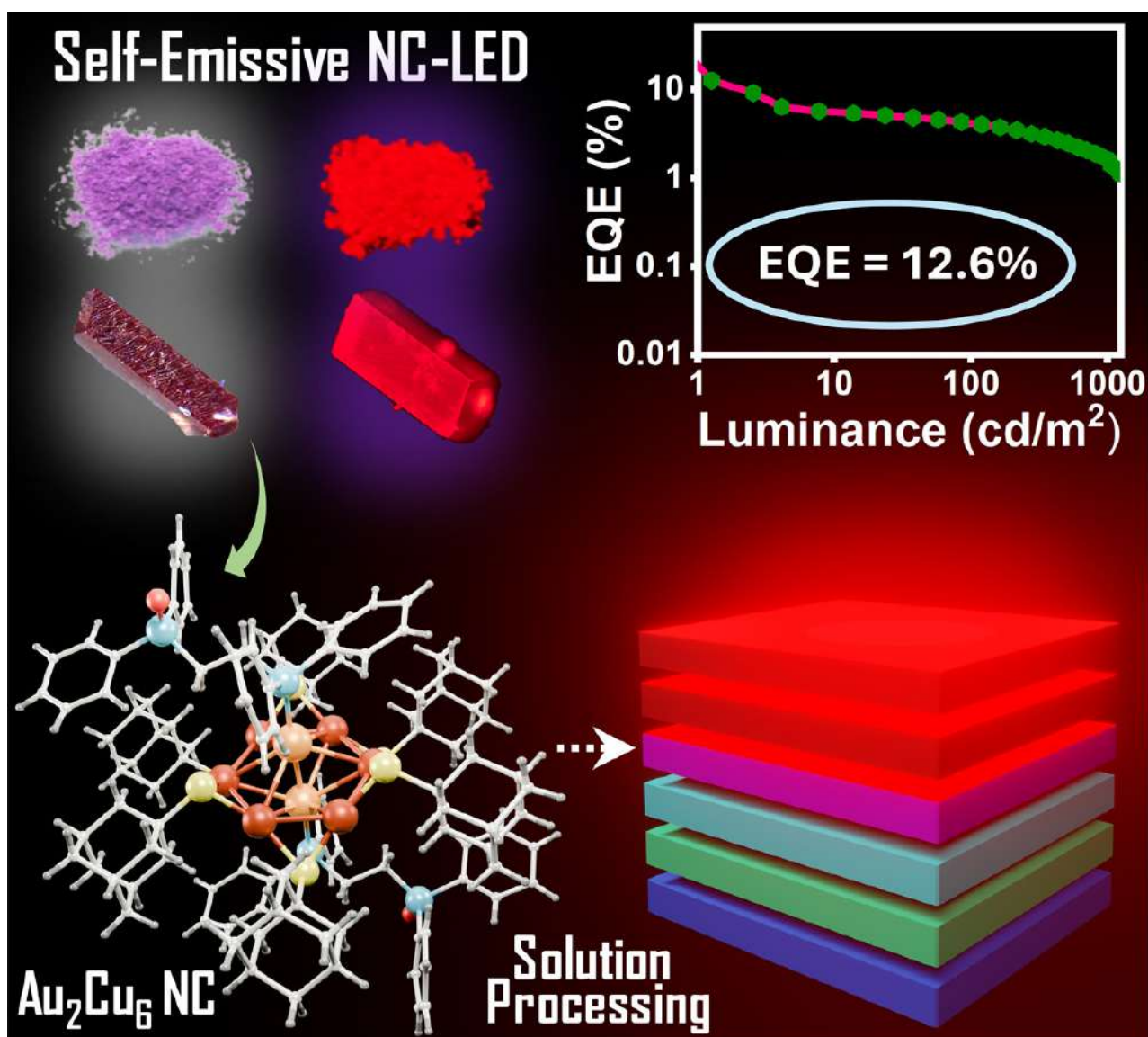

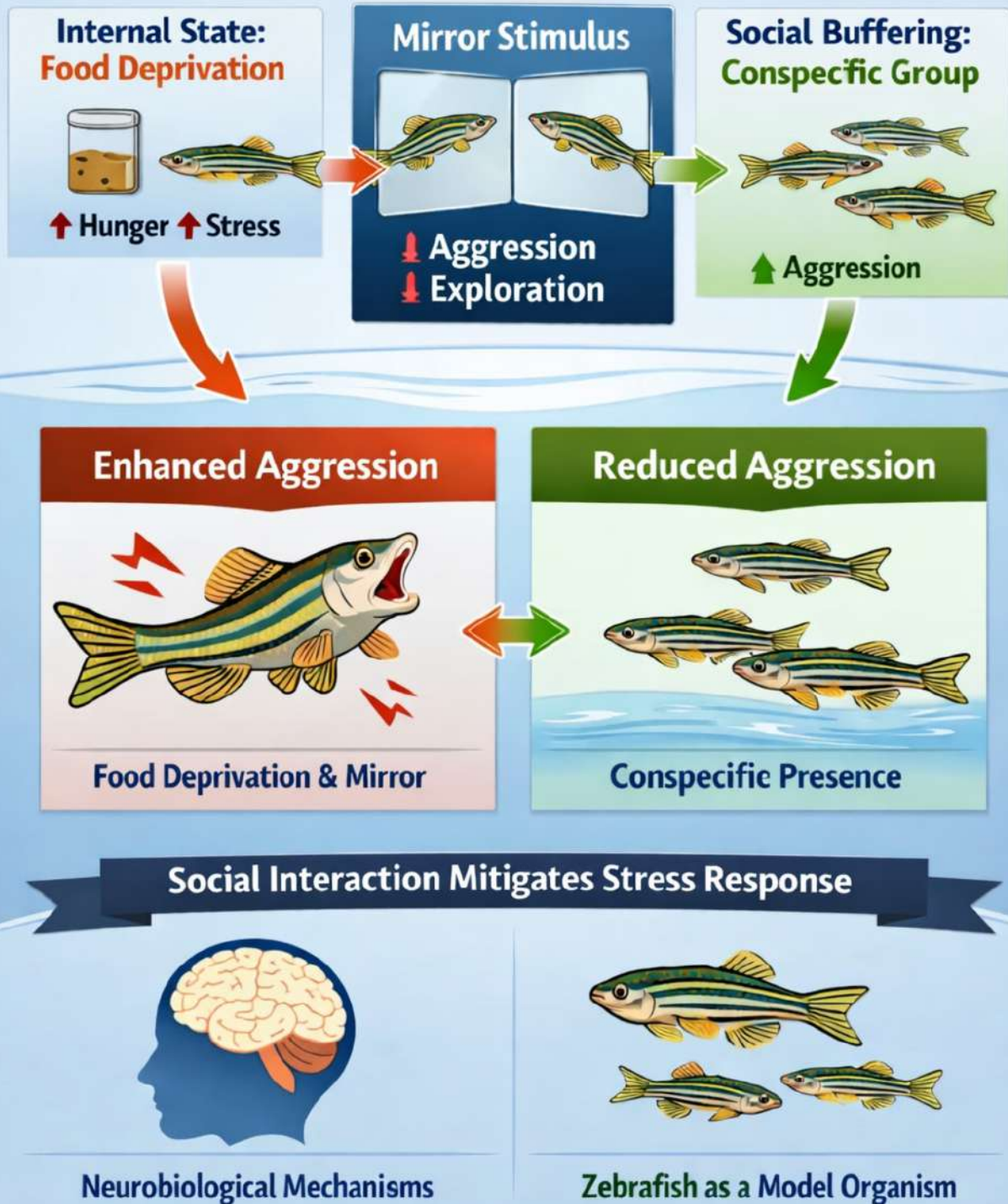

Brief details of the work :

The Calicut University Computer Centre (CUCC) plays a pivotal role in offering comprehensive IT-related services for Calicut University. Since it acts as a central Hub for ICT related services various e-governance initiatives are implemented in the University through CUCC. Major services are:

Central Hub for ICT Services: CUCC serves as a central hub for various ICT-related services, facilitating e-governance initiatives within the university.

E-Governance Initiatives: CUCC has implemented several significant digital services, such as Centralized Admission Processing, Examination-related activities through Pareeksha Bhavan, Degree Certificate Verification System, equivalency and migration system, Examination timetable management system, e-Payment system, Barcode Management System, Centralised Valuation Camp Management System, Recruitment Portal, Integrated Student's Portal, Students' Grievance Redressal System, Department and College Portal, Payroll, and Finance Management System (CUFIN) etc.

Software Development: The in-house software development team at CUCC has successfully developed and continues to maintain U-ARMS (University Academic Resource Management System), a sophisticated and comprehensive software solution supporting the university's operations. U-ARMS efficiently manages the entire student lifecycle, integrating key functionalities such as the College/Department Portal, Student Portal, Centralized Admission Management System, Research Portal, and Examination Management System. This advanced platform highlights the team's exceptional expertise and commitment to elevating academic and administrative efficiency across the University.

Support and Maintenance: CUCC provides support for the implementation and maintenance of various systems like Biometric Punching, Institutional Email services, SMS Gateway integration, Video conferencing systems (G Suite and WebEx), Campus LAN, Wi-Fi, Surveillance System, Biometric Punching System, and Data Centre facilities.

Support for e-Learning: CUCC provides technical support for e-Learning initiatives, including maintaining Learn Space (a Moodle-based Learning Management System - LMS). It also provides necessary technical support for, SUVEGA - the Digital Students' Service Centre and Radio CU.

CUCC is instrumental in providing a wide array of IT-related services and infrastructure crucial for the smooth functioning of Calicut University, ranging from administrative and academic support systems to infrastructure management and e-Learning facilitation.

Special achievements during year 2025:

During the year 2025, the CUCC has conscientiously directed its endeavors towards offering essential technical support for the following projects:

(a) Software for Directorate of Physical Education :

The Portal is a comprehensive software solution developed to enhance coordination, transparency, and operational efficiency in the planning, execution, and monitoring of Physical Education programs and events across all affiliated colleges. By providing a unified digital platform, it enables seamless interaction between colleges and the central department, ensuring consistent communication, streamlined workflows, and effective data management.

The system automates several key functions of the department, including event scheduling, participant registration, performance tracking, and result compilation, thereby reducing manual effort and the potential for errors. Through real-time access to information and centralized data storage, the portal promotes accountability, standardization, and improved decision-making across all institutions.

In addition, the portal features a dedicated module for the generation and distribution of Inter-Collegiate Certificates, allowing colleges to easily generate, download, and print certificates directly from the system. This not only enhances accuracy and authenticity but also ensures convenience and efficiency in record-keeping and documentation.

(b) Syndicate Portal :

To streamline and digitize the process of convening syndicate meetings, a dedicated Syndicate Meeting Management Portal has been developed. The portal provides an end-to-end solution for scheduling, managing, and conducting syndicate meetings in an efficient, transparent, and paperless manner. It automates several administrative tasks traditionally handled manually, ensuring accuracy, timeliness, and accountability.

The portal has significantly improved the convening process by reducing administrative workload, improving communication with members, and ensuring timely circulation of meeting materials. It serves as a scalable and user-friendly platform adaptable for future enhancements.

(c) Calicut University Four Year UG Programme (FYUGP) :

The University of Calicut proposes to formulate a set of new regulations for the four-year UG programmes in a larger context. These regulations envisage a people-centred knowledge society that takes into account the rich diversity of our society and the varied aspirations of the diverse groups that constitute it. In the year 2024, the CUCC has diligently dedicated its efforts to developing and implementing dedicated software support for the conduct of Calicut University Four Year UG Programme (CUFYUGP) within the stipulated time frame. In addition to this CUCC is supporting two more software projects including a Comprehensive Sports Event Management and Research Portal for the Department of Physical Education and a Comprehensive Portal for ODL Programmes at the School of Distance Education

(d) Online Certificate Portal for MMTTC :

Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Centres (MMTTC) namely UGC-Human Resource Development Centres (HRDCs) have significantly contributed to training faculty. CUCC developed an online Certificate portal for Faculty Induction / Orientation Programme, Refresher and Short Term Courses of a large number of College and University teachers within and outside the state. MMTTC also organizes Professional Development Course for the Non-Academic Staff, Interaction Programme for Ph.D Scholars / Post Doctoral Fellows, Short Term Course for the Professional Development of Academic Staff of Universities / Colleges and National level seminars in various topics in different disciplines. In addition to the above mentioned programmes the MMTTC is organizing diversified training programmes of three days duration for the faculties of Self Financing Engineering Colleges / Training Colleges etc.

(e) Hostel Admission Portal:

To simplify and digitize the process of hostel admissions for students within the university campus, a comprehensive Hostel Admission Management Portal has been developed. The portal is designed to automate all stages of the hostel admission process ensuring a transparent, efficient, and student-friendly experience.

The portal has greatly improved the efficiency and transparency of hostel admissions, ensuring a smoother experience for both students and administrators. It has contributed to better data management, faster processing times, and enhanced accountability across the hostel administration process.

(f) Comprehensive Research Portal:

CUCC has skillfully designed and developed an Integrated Research Portal tailored to cater to the diverse needs of research scholars while streamlining the management processes of the Directorate of Research (DoR) at the University of Calicut. This robust and comprehensive portal incorporates an array of functional modules aimed at enhancing operational efficiency, fostering academic excellence, and providing seamless support for scholarly pursuits.

Calicut University Press is an important supporting service to cater to the printing job needs of the University. Major work of the University Press includes printing of Text books, Study Materials of SDE, Marklists, Certificates, Blank Answer Papers of Pareeksha Bhavan, Forms, Ledgers and other various printing needs of Administration & other Departments. Printing of Annual Report, Hand Book, Budget etc. are some of the other major printing works undertaken in the University Press. University Press is fully functioning under Offset technology with 30 technical staff. The post of Superintendent is vacant and Assistant Registrar is in charge of the Press as an interim arrangement. Moreover Bsc./B.Tech Printing Technology students are availing the facilities provided in the Press for their Practical Studies.

University Press is constantly striving to achieve efficiency and effectiveness in all the work it undertakes. Plate making unit has been equipped with new CTP machine, which quickly prepares plates for printing works. 2 Hi Web Offset Printing Machine has been installed recently to speed up the printing works by a multiple fold. Press is planning to purchase new machineries for binding and digital printers. Plan Proposal for the Modernization with the installation of Multi Colour Offset Printer, Computers and other High Tech Machines is under consideration of the University.

Brief Details of Work :

The mission of the Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE) is to provide accessible distance/ online learning opportunities to under-served populations, enabling them to pursue quality higher education, and developing advanced competencies.

The CDOE has been authorised by the UGC to offer a total of 25 programmes (13 Under Graduate Programmes and 12 Post Graduate Programmes) until January 2026, under distance education mode.

Currently the CDOE is not admitting students to programmes under distance mode, due to restriction imposed by Government. The CDOE is in the process of starting programmes under online mode. More details about this will be

released in due course.

The CDOE oversees the admission process for Open and Distance Learning (ODL) Programmes. To enhance accessibility, the Centre has implemented online facilities for admission and fee payments. Additionally the CDOE offers comprehensive Learner Support Services including printed Self Learning Materials, Online study resources, and contact classes for its students. The curriculum and syllabus of the programmes offered by CDOE align with those of the regular mode programmes. The centre also facilitates readmission for students who discontinued their studies for various reasons. Furthermore students enrolled in regular college programmes are provided opportunity to continue their studies through CDOE by exercising the 'Stream Change' option.

In the academic year 2023-24, 22501 students were admitted through distance education.

All learners receive printed Self- Learning Materials and all study materials are also available online through the CDOE website, ensuring access from any location. The centre maintains a well equipped library accessible to learners and faculty.

The CDOE operates 10 learner support centres established in colleges affiliated to the University of Calicut in the districts of Thrissur, Palakkad, Malappuram, Kozhikode, and Wayanad.

The distribution of study materials to the door steps of the students through Mode of Understanding with Indian Postal Department, in addition to the soft copies of the study materials provided through HEI Website . The CDOE also conducts Direct and online classes for students before the end semester examinations.

The centre is proposing to offer 3 UG programmes and 6 PG programmes in online mode, preparation of online learning platform and e-content are under way.

In addition to conducting contact classes, the Assistant Professors on contract are actively engaged in preparation of e- content for the proposed online programmes as well.

1. Cultural Activities

The Department of Students Welfare oversees the students participation and performance in University level, south Indian level, national level and southeast Asia level Arts festivals. It has helped the students bring many laurels University Union has been monitoring by the Department of Students' Welfare. The Interzone Arts Festival was not conducted during the academic year 2023–24; hence, our university has not participated in the 2024–25 South Zone and National competitions.

2. Students Grievance Redressal Cell

The Board for Adjudication of Students' Grievances (BASG) adjudicates the complaints of students of affiliated institutions and teaching departments of the University of Calicut. The Board for Adjudication of Students' Grievances (BASG) is constituted by Calicut University, consisting 11 members, as stipulated by the Provisions of Chapter 27, Calicut University First Statutes, 1977 and as per the existing UGC rules. During the past many years, this body has redressed many students complaints with an inclination for the well being of the students and institutions. With regard to many older and bigger affiliated institutions, as and when students are given improper punishment with vengeance to end their academic life, the Board for adjudication of Students' Grievances (BASG) has intervened on the basis of students complaints, conducted enquiries properly and suggested remedial measures. During the past five years statistics shows that the number of complaints increases which gives a sign that the student community accept this process as a reliable one, compared to the other mechanisms.

3. University Level Anti-Ragging Committee (ULARC)

The ULARC has considered several complaints/appeals from the students of affiliated institutions. It also conducted independent enquiries, on certain complaints where the Principals/HoDs had failed to act as per UGC Anti-Ragging Regulations. Students who found guilty by the Cell were awarded punishments as per the Anti-ragging regulations.

Posters and pamphlets for Anti-Ragging campaign were distributed to various colleges/institutions affiliated to the University. In compliance with the direction of the Hon'ble Supreme Court monthly comprehensive feedback on Anti ragging measures is forwarded to the Governor's Secretariat before the 5th of every month.

4. Foreign Students Affairs

The department also functions as the International students Office of the university, the DSW being the International Students Adviser of the University. A large number of foreign students are approaching the University every year for admission to various courses including Ph.D. programmes. All these admissions, bank account, police verifications and other formalities are taken care of this office.

Brief details of the work/activities:

In the wake of unprecedented Covid 19 surge, the University has set up the Digital Students service Centre - SUEGA to help out all levels of stakeholders (internal and external). SUEGA is a state-of-the-Art Call Centre facility designed and implemented in a customer Relationship Model for handling the students queries and grievances.

It is the first of its kind in the State Universities of the country, specially designed to assist every stakeholder of the University who is in need of information/service assistance. The project was launched by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Kerala, Sri. Pinarayi Vijayan on 27/10/2020. The service is presently available at the dedicated phone number - **0494 2660 600**. The language support provided to the stakeholders are English, Hindi and Malayalam. **Working Hours : 12 hours a day, ie; 08.00 am to 08.00 pm without Break .**

The major objectives are as follows:

- To reduce the difficulties faced by the academic community/citizens while accessing the services offered by the university and the specific follow up support required related to the same.
- Providing real time responses to the enquiries received from all levels of stakeholders via calls, e-mails and live chat assisted by the call centre facility.
- Resolve the enquiries/grievances by routing it to the nodal Officers appointed in the various departments/Branches with the help of the integrated students Grievance Management Portal.
- To document and report the student queries and feed back to improve the services and data driven decision making .
- To initiate studies and research in the areas of natural language processing, data/speech analytics and machine learning with the aim of all integration in the Call Centre services.

How it Works :

SUEGA ensures a dedicated call Centre support for queries raised by the students related to Admission, Exams and Academic matters . Hence utmost care is taken while designing and implementing the project to ensure ,

- 1) Better Productivity: The agents continuously attend the students queries to provide the precise information/ solution to them within the stipulated time frame. Hence the system is designed to make the agents more productive for catering to more calls/tickets .
- 2) Respond to queries in real time without making students to wait on call or transferring calls to other agents by quickly accessing the information needed to resolve their queries.
- 3) Integrated knowledge base cuts down the time that the agents spend on looking for the information required for responding to a support ticket. This considerably improved the issue resolution rate.
- 4) As the domain knowledge play a major role which if shared appropriately can bring immense efficiency in the operations and services offered.
- 5) The knowledge Base created in the form of process description FAQ, software application interfaces etc. as part of the solution helps to get quick resolution of issues or needs in a systematic way.
- 6) This also helps our call Agents and the stakeholders with the power of integrated knowledge base to find quick answers to their queries.

- 7) SUVEGA is presently catering to the needs of the students and faculty members of the 35+ University Teaching Departments, 400+ Affiliated Colleges and students enrolled in the SDE under the University spread across Five Northern Districts of Kerala .
- 8) The unanswered calls are being attended by the Help of the Calling Back Facility. Hence, it is ensured that no callers are left unattended.
- 9) The number of calls have increased this year comparing to the previous years . During admission notified days, about 350 calls were taken by one call agent in one day itself .
- 10) Understanding the pulse and needs of the youth, SUVEGA has ensured its role in the Social Media by **providing information on Instagram page 'Calicut University Official' as well as on the Official You tube channel.** This has been done by the initiative of the Office of the Public Relations Officer.
11. SUVEGA Students Portal at the University Website is updated in time and about major 37 No.s of FAQs have been updated in accordance with the University orders issued, enabling the students to move with the guidelines and procedures for submission of various application forms.
12. SUVEGA has become **a part of Radio CU telecasting informative programmes** on the services offered by the University .

1. One personnel from SUVEGA had participated in **International Conclave on Next Gen Higher Education representing University of Calicut held at CUSAT, conducted by the Higher Education Department .**
2. Single Window Admission Process offers facility for candidates to submit a single online application for admission to various UG and PG programmes in different affiliated colleges of the University, University Centres and also to University Teaching Departments.

- 2. Fixation of fee structure:** Govt. of Kerala issues orders regarding the fee structure of different regular and self financing UG and PG programmes from time to time. DoA implements these Government orders and issues University Orders after placing it before appropriate bodies.
- 3. Updating and Clarifying Grace Mark Rules:** Grace mark Committee Meetings are convened by the DoA, for considering and clarifying different matters with regard to the award of grace marks for various programmes. DoA issues formal University Orders after placing the matters before appropriate bodies. DoA also prepares Admission Calendar for different categories of programmes in the University, for both UG & PG with entrance and without entrance examinations.
- 4. Convening the Admission Monitoring Committee:** All kinds of disparities and irregularities in the admission process are brought to the consideration of Admission Monitoring Committee and their recommendations are placed before Syndicate. The final orders are being issued based on the decision of the Syndicate.
- 5. College Transfer & Inter university Transfer (with and without Major Switching) of FYUG Programme:** The Directorate of Admissions (DoA) has successfully conducted the FYUGP Third Semester College Transfer and Inter-University Transfer processes of the candidates admitted in 2024 Academic Year. The procedures included College Transfer with and without Major Switching, as well as Inter-University Transfer with and without Major Switching. The major activities carried out are detailed below:
 - **College Transfer – Notification, Application & Allotment:** Notifications inviting online applications for College Transfer (with/without Major Switching) were issued to students of FYUGP programmes in affiliated colleges. A rank list, based on First and Second Semester Grade Points, was prepared for all applicants and circulated to affiliated colleges. Admissions were made according to rank and availability of seats.
 - **Inter-University Transfer – Rank List & Admission:** After completing the College Transfer process, DoA issued notifications for Inter-University Transfer (with/without Major Switching). Eligible students from Regular, Open, and Distance Mode FYUGP programmes of universities within and outside Kerala were allowed to apply. All applicants were assigned CAPID, and a rank list based on First and Second Semester Grade Points was prepared and forwarded to the affiliated colleges for admission.

The Directorate of University Study Centres deals with works related to the Study Centres (Self Financing) directly run by the University on no profit no loss basis. Presently, there are 40 Centres spread over the districts of Palakkad, Malappuram, Thrissur, Kozhikode and Wayanad which offer diverse courses at Under-graduate and Post-graduate levels. The Study Centres work on a cost sharing basis. The programmes offered include B.Tech programmes, B.Sc AI, BCA, BSW, M.Sc Computer Science, MCA, MBA, B.Sc Costume and Fashion Designing, M.Sc in Environmental Sciences, M.Sc Applied Geology, M.Sc in Radiation Physics, MA Sociology, MSW, B.PEd, B.PEs Integrated, B.Ed, One year LLM, M.Sc Food Science & Technology, etc. The nature of work includes file works related to setting up of new Study Centres, hiring of building space, purchase of equipment, appointment and re-engagement of teaching/non-teaching staff on contract, sanctioning of remuneration, relief etc. of contract employees. The work also includes the matters of general administration of the Centres. Through the centres, it has been possible for the University to impart quality education in various disciplines to thousands of aspirants at moderate rate of fee and also to redress to a large extent, the regional imbalance existed in the field of higher education. These Study Centres are mainly focused in the rural areas of the districts. The students from the backward areas rely on these centres which offer programmes in under graduate post graduate level.

- The University Study Centres which are occupied in rented buildings has been shifted to the nearest University Study Centre buildings, viz School of Management Studies Palakkad & Centre for Computer Science and Information Technology Centre Palakkad has been shifted to the Study Centre building in Koduvayur, School of Management Studies Calicut has been shifted to Study Centre building in Calicut and Centre for Computer Science and Information Technology Manjeri has been shifted to Study Centre building in Malappuram. Centre for PG Studies has been shifted to the Study Centre building in Kozhikode.
- University has sanctioned B.Sc Artificial Intelligence at Centre for Computer Science and Information Technology Manjeri and Centre for Computer Science and Information Technology Vatakara in the academic year 2025-26. University has started evening MBA programme in School of Management Studies Palakkad.

University Engineering Department was established in 1968 with the purpose of designing, construction and maintenance of all infrastructure facilities of the University. At present this Department deals with all the construction and maintenance work of University Campus which spreads over an area, about 520 acres of land under Pallikkal,

Chelembra and Thenhipalam Grama Panchayats in Malappuram District and University extension centres at Arnattukara, in Thrissur District and Vadakara in Kozhikode District and the Campus for Tribal Studies and Research in Chethalayam, Wayanad District.

Engineering Department is handling various works such as construction of new buildings, renovation and maintenance works for existing buildings of various Departments in the University Campus. In addition to this, the construction and maintenance of infrastructure at UTEC Centres at Sulthanbathery, Kaniyampatta, Calicut, Chakkittapara, Manjery, Malappuram, Koduvayoor and Valappad comes under the Engineering Department.

Engineering Department also provides uninterrupted water and power supply and good road facilities inside the Campus. Since there is no dependable water source in the Campus, water is collected from the nearest perennial source, Kadalundy River at Parakkadavu, which is about 10 Kms. on southern side. The water is brought to the Campus through underground cast iron pipes. The water is treated, made potable and stored in various overhead and ground level tanks. Construction of rain water harvesting reservoirs in the campus was also started.

Similarly, electricity is purchased in bulk through dedicated feeder system from KSEBL to avoid voltage drops and distributed throughout the Campus. The system is also coupled with generator backup to avoid power failure. Wide network of street-lights light up the Campus during night hours. In addition to this the enhancement of substation capacity in the main Campus and JMC Campus were completed. Installation of solar energy units in various locations has also been executed.

There are so many buildings in the Campus for administration and education purpose, such as Administration block, Pareeksha Bhavan, Tagore Nikethan, Central Composite Science Block, Building for Students Distance Education, Indore Stadium, Swimming Pool and 348 Quarters of different types to accommodate the teaching and non-teaching staff, Guest Houses with A/C and Non A/C rooms and also hostels for working men and women, Hostels for Students, the maintenance and repair of which are done by this Department. Projects for enhancing the capacity for accommodation in the hostels are being taken up.

The Engineering Department also provides and maintains necessary infrastructure facilities like, Academic Block, Workshops, Laboratories, overhead Water tanks and distribution system, well, Canteen, Play grounds and Hostel facilities for both men and women, Electrical substation, etc. to the Calicut University Institute of Engineering and Technology which is run by the University of Calicut at Kohinoor, 2 Km. away from the main Campus.

The details of the work and Special achievements of Engineering Department during the year 2025

Major Civil projects completed during 2025 are as follows:

- 1) Construction of a portion of the first storey of the building for C H Chair for studies on developing society.
- 2) Construction of a building for installation of web offset printing machine.
- 3) Construction of a new Planetarium in the Campus.

The IQAC coordinates all activities pertaining to NAAC accreditation, including the filing of Institutional Information for Quality Assessment (IIQA), providing support to NAAC Criterion Committees in the preparation of Self Study Reports (SSR), and managing all arrangements and documentation related to Peer Team visits. The Cell also ensures the timely preparation and of the Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) in accordance with NAAC guidelines and parameters.

Data Management and Statutory Compliance

The IQAC responds to surveys conducted by national departments and agencies such as MoE, UGC & NAAC. It prepares and submits data for the All India Survey on Higher Education (AISHE), and All Kerala Higher Education Survey (AKHES). The Cell maintains quality-related communication and ensures timely compilation and submission of data to the UGC, Association of Indian Universities (AIU), and the Association of Commonwealth Universities (ACU), United Kingdom.

State-level Reporting and Documentation

The IQAC prepares Quarterly Reports and Action Taken Reports on the actionable recommendations for submission to the Hon'ble Governor. Brief Details of the work :

In pursuance of the policies laid down under the National Policy on Education 1986 and its Program of Action, the MMTTC is functioning in the University to organize specially designed Faculty Development Programs to train the faculties in Higher Education sector to overcome the challenges faced by them against the unprecedented explosion of knowledge and ever increasing number of students. The Ministry of Education, Government of India has integrated the HRDCs and PMMMNMTT Centres for meeting the objective of NEP 2020. As a part of the UGC HRDC, University of Calicut was identified as a part of the programme which will be called as “MALAVIYA MISSION TEACHER TRAINING CENTRE”. Malaviya Mission Teacher Training programme (MMTTP) was launched on the occasion of Teachers’ Day on 5th september 2023.

The mission aims to transform higher education by integrating Indian values and ethos into teaching, research, publications, patents, and institutional development.

Functions

The Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Centre is catering the needs of teachers of the colleges/universities in accordance with the guidelines of the UGC from time to time by offering Induction programmes/ refresher courses/NEP Orientation & Sensitization

programme / short term courses to build competencies in faculty for better teaching, learning, research and academic leadership by aligning them with Indian values and updating their knowledge and skills according to the needs of society and NEP 2020.

The main functions of Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Centre is to plan, organize, implement, monitor and evaluate Orientation Programmes / Faculty Induction Programmes for newly appointed Assistant Professors in Colleges / Universities all over India. Resource Persons and thrust area for each Refresher Course will be decided by the Director in consultation with the Course Coordinators.

MMTTC usually:

- Formulates programmes such as Faculty Induction Programme/ Refresher Courses/ Short-Term Courses/ NEP Orientation & Sensitization programme etc. along the broad guidelines given above.
- Identify Resource Persons in various fields of specialization for running the Orientation/Induction Programmes, Refresher Courses and familiarize such Resource Persons with the philosophy and guidelines for the courses.
- Set up a documentation – centre – cum - library for reference and source materials necessary for the courses.
- Produce specially designed material required for effective implementation of the courses.
- Organize, monitor and evaluate the courses for teachers.
- Create a culture of learning and self-improvement among teachers so that it becomes an integral part of the educational system at the tertiary level.
- Provide opportunities for teachers in service to exchange experience with their peers and to mutually learn from each other.

- h. Provide a forum for serving teachers to keep themselves abreast of the latest advances in various subjects.
- i. Provide opportunities to further widen their knowledge and to pursue research studies.
- j. Provide an introduction to new methods and innovations in Higher Education so that the participants can in turn develop their own innovative methods of instruction.

Brief Details of Work:

Examination General Section (EG-I Section): handles all general work connected with the conduct of examinations, including the issuance of Notifications and Time Tables for regular, supplementary, and special examinations; publishing of all Time Tables and examination related notification at the University website, preparation of the Academic-cum-Examination Calendar; fixation of examination fees; consolidation of data for the Annual Report, Quarterly Report and other statutory submissions; and furnishing replies to queries received from the Offices of the Chancellor, Legislative Assembly, Chief Minister, Senate and through RTI applications. The Section also manages Centre Allotment for PG SDE examinations and specific UG courses, conducts Special Examinations for Sports, NCC and NSS candidates, arranges re-examinations necessitated due to various reasons, communication with the post office relating to the bundle report connected with the valuation camp and issues all general communications and University Orders pertaining to Pareeksha Bhavan.

Examination General Section (EG-II Section): deals with matters related to the conduct of valuation camps, including the issuance of various orders and initiation of disciplinary action against teachers who willfully evade valuation duties. The Section is also responsible for the appointment of Chief Superintendents for University examinations. In addition to its routine functions, EG-II undertakes other general duties assigned by the Controller of Examinations.

Examination Confidential Section: deals with the work of setting question papers of various University Examinations and Entrance Examinations of the entrance oriented UG, PG & Ph.D Programmes and other related works.

EX Section: Question Paper Setting (Confidential)

Special Supplementary Examination Unit: handles applications and requests for conducting One-Time Regular Supplementary Examinations for chance-exhausted candidates who completed their courses in 1995 or later. The Unit is responsible for issuing examination notifications, processing applications, publishing time tables, and distributing manual hall tickets to candidates. It also coordinates invigilation duties for One-Time Regular Supplementary Examinations, Re-examinations, and Special Examinations. In addition, the Unit undertakes false numbering, appointment of examiners for the valuation of answer scripts, distribution and collection of answer scripts for

valuation, decoding of marks, and handing over counterfoils and mark sheets to the concerned sections.

ECQ Section: is responsible for preparing the consolidated DCB Statement of Pareeksha Bhavan and coordinating the consolidation of replies to KSAD and CAG Audit objections pertaining to Pareeksha Bhavan. The Section issues University Orders fixing and revising remuneration rates for various courses and programmes, processes remuneration payments to examiners from both imprest and non-imprest funds for the conduct of valuation camps of Regular and SDE examinations, and initiates recoupment of expenditure from the Finance Branch. It also handles expenditure related to the conduct of examinations (Regular and SDE), including remuneration and TA/DA to question paper setters (imprest), vehicle maintenance and fuel charges for PB vehicles (imprest), computer consumables and maintenance, miscellaneous imprest expenditure, and maintenance of the cash book. In addition, the Section processes payments to colleges in Kozhikode, Thrissur, Palakkad, Malappuram, and Wayanad districts for copying downloaded question papers, as well as TA/DA payments to examiners (imprest and non-imprest) attending various camps, practicals, and meetings. It coordinates payments for stationery, printing, postage, repair/AMC, and remuneration/wages to CLR and Guest staff. The Section also manages contingent expenditure (imprest and non-imprest), hire charges of vehicles for PB, and payments to Camp Directors of barcode-based CV Camps from the imprest amount sanctioned to the Controller of Examinations.

Monitoring Cell: is responsible for overseeing the smooth conduct of all examinations under the University of Calicut. Its functions include coordinating all logistical activities such as the distribution of question papers (as the case may be), barcodes, and answer booklets to colleges, as well as the collection of answer scripts from affiliated colleges across the five districts. The Section also handles the redistribution of collected answer scripts to designated valuation camps and ensures their proper delivery to Pareeksha Bhavan.

EST (Exam Store I): deals with the purchase, supply, and payment of all examination-related materials, including stationery, reel paper, blank computer-generated grade cards and mark lists, original degree folders, examination-related forms, and envelopes. The Section also manages the storage and distribution of laptops and barcode readers to examination valuation camps. It maintains stock entries of all items- including electronic devices, furniture, and stationery- procured for the use of Pareeksha Bhavan, and handles the submission and settlement of advance contingent bills.

EST- II (Exam Store- II): is responsible for a wide range of activities related to vehicle management, fuel administration, disposal of examination materials, and other supporting functions of Pareeksha Bhavan. The Section oversees the maintenance of all nine vehicles currently in use, processing requests from drivers for repair work, periodic servicing, and renewal of insurance, tax, permits, and fitness certificates, and ensuring that payments to the concerned firms are completed. All repair and service details are recorded in Part B of the Spare Register maintained for each vehicle. Fuel for the vehicles is supplied through P.P. Petroleum, Kakkanchery, and the Section processes both machine and manual bills, completing all steps until payment is released from the imprest advance sanctioned to the Controller of Examinations (ECQ Section). Based on the requirements of the Monitoring Cell, EST-II also handles the allocation of vehicles and drivers to various routes connected with examination activities.

The Section is additionally responsible for the disposal of valued answer scripts, unused question papers, waste cardboard, and scrap tyres. This involves inviting quotations or e-tenders, arranging for the publication of notices in newspapers and on the University website, executing agreements with approved bidders, and issuing delivery notes for the removal of waste materials. Valued answer scripts and unused question papers stored in the Old Islamic Chair Building and the Controller of Examinations' Building, respectively, are disposed of according to the terms of the agreement valid for one year. Waste cardboard and scrap tyres stored in the Pareeksha Bhavan premises are also removed by inviting quotations for each item type.

Other responsibilities include preparing replies to RTI applications and audit queries; overseeing the loading, removal, and proper storage of waste materials in the designated godown; forwarding fuel bills, vouchers, and related documents to other branches; maintaining the vehicle log book with entries on fuel consumption and kilometre readings; and coordinating visits to the Regional Transport Office and District Insurance Office, Malappuram, for renewal of vehicle fitness certificates and insurance.

B.A. Branch: handles all examination tabulation activities, including verification of examination registrations, APC details, internal marks, fee collection, and related processes leading up to the issuance of semester-wise grade cards, consolidated grade cards, and provisional certificates. The Branch also manages works related to barcode-based valuation camps and the preparation of Original Degree Certificates, Duplicate Mark Lists, Official Transcripts, and Genuineness Verification for BA Regular, Afzal-ul-Ulama, and Afzal-ul-Ulama Prelims programmes. Additional responsibilities include allocation of scribes, finalisation of suspected malpractice cases, awarding of grace marks, correction of names, and issuance of various miscellaneous certificates. Further, all other examination-related works of the colleges allotted under FYUGP are also carried out by this Branch.

B.Com branch: handles all examination-related activities including tabulation, verification of examination

registrations, fee collection, APC and internal mark verification, preparation and issuance of mark lists, grade cards, consolidated grade cards, duplicate mark lists, certificates, and correction of names in mark lists, grade cards, and degree certificates. The Branch processes late registrations, verifies applications along with Attendance and Progress Certificates, prepares manual tabulation registers for Special Supplementary yearly-pattern examinations, and verifies digitally prepared tabulation registers. It manages withholding of SMP results, processes defective applications, appoints scribes, handles optional/elective changes, provisional registrations, effecting marks after revaluation, and issuing revised mark lists/grade cards, provisional certificates, duplicate mark lists/grade cards and duplicate degree certificates. The Branch also undertakes genuineness verification, transcript verification, cancellation of registration, course discontinuation, entry of grace marks, preparation of DCB statements, keeping of FFR, tracing and indexing of tabulation registers, and mark entry of special examinations and One-Time Special Supplementary Examinations. In addition, the Branch coordinates barcode-based valuation camps, issues result notifications, supports the conduct of Pass Board Meetings, publishes results and position lists, updates fee structures in the examination software, processes RTI/RTS queries, furnishes degree eligibility details to the Senate, and handles all matters related to false numbering, dispatch and retrieval of answer scripts, wrong mapping, bundling issues, and returned scripts. It also manages practical mark collection, CLR wage processing for barcode camps, constitution of Boards of Examiners for FYUGP, distribution of printed mark lists and tabulation registers, submission of data for University Merit Scholarships, verification and publication of CGC/PC white prints, indexing and issuance of unclaimed documents, consolidation of DCB statements for finance and audit purposes, and storage, binding, and supervision of tabulation registers. Tabulation work related to One-Time Regular Supplementary Examinations conducted by the Special Supplementary Wing- including issuance of mark lists and provisional certificates- is also carried out in this Branch, along with all other examination-related work of the colleges allotted under FYUGP.

B.Sc Branch: conducts theory and practical examinations for students enrolled in 33 B.Sc. programmes and the BCA programme under the University. The Branch organises valuation camps, tabulates marks, publishes results, and issues grade cards and degree certificates. It also processes applications for revaluation of answer scripts as requested by students. To support higher education pursuits, the Branch issues rank certificates. Additionally, it provides verification services to employers and institutions of higher learning for confirming the genuineness of certificates submitted by job applicants or candidates seeking admission. All other examination-related work of the colleges allotted under FYUGP is also carried out by this Branch.

P.G. Branch handles all examination-related work pertaining to Post Graduate and Integrated PG programmes offered in the University Teaching Departments, affiliated colleges, and the Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE), along with the project-mode Diploma programmes conducted exclusively in the University Departments. The Branch undertakes QC verification, APC verification, paper addition and deletion, timetable entry, false numbering, mark entry, comparison of tabulation registers, result publication, and preparation of consolidated mark lists, provisional certificates (PC), transfer certificates (TC), and Original Degree Certificates. It also manages the issuance of official transcripts, genuineness verification of academic records, and provides unclaimed mark lists on request.

B.Tech Branch: handles all examination-related activities of the B.Tech and B.Arch programmes, including tabulation work, conduct of jury, practical examinations, barcode-based valuation (CV) camps, publication of results for regular, supplementary, and One-Time Regular Supplementary (Special Supplementary) examinations, and the issuance of degree certificates, abstracts of academic records, duplicate mark lists/degree/other certificates, official transcripts, genuineness verifications, and general certificates. Under the University, the Calicut University Institute of Engineering and Technology (CUIET), Thenhipalam, offers regular B.Tech programmes in six branches: Computer Science and Engineering, Electrical and Electronics Engineering, Electronics and Communication Engineering, Electronics and Computer Science Engineering, Mechanical Engineering, and Printing Technology- the last of which is uniquely offered only at CUIET in all of South India. Lateral entry to B.Tech is also offered, and the 2024 Scheme follows an Outcome-Based Education (OBE) curriculum. The B.Arch programme is a five-year professional degree in Architecture, currently offered under the 2022 Scheme, blending theoretical and practical training in architectural design and construction. The Branch manages examinations for B.Tech (16 branches under the 2K, 2009, and 2014 Schemes; 5 branches under the 2019 Scheme; and 6 branches under the 2024 Scheme) and for B.Arch under the 2K, 2004, and 2012 Schemes.

EPR Branch: manages the conduct of examinations for more than 100 professional programmes, including tabulation, convening Pass Board Meetings, publishing results, and issuing various mark lists and certificates. The Branch also handles bar council verifications, genuineness verifications, issuance of official transcripts, and related examination services. Programmes dealt with include MCA, BA Multimedia/BMMC, B.Ed., M.Ed., BLiSc, MLiSc, BFA, LLM, BPED, MPED, BBA LLB, LLB Unitary, BCom LLB, MSc Radiation Physics, MSc Food Science & Technology, MVoc, BHM, MHM, BTA, MTA, M.Arch, MTech (including Nano Science & Technology), MA Journalism & Mass Communication/MCJ, MBA, MTHM, BVoc (23 programmes), BSc Paramedical courses, BPharm, MTech, M Planning, MPharm, BPT, MPT, MSc Paramedical, BSc Nursing, MSc Nursing, MBBS, PG Medicine, BDS, MDS, BAMS, MD Ayurveda, BHMS, MD Homeo, BPE, MHA, MBC, MJT, and various postgraduate diplomas and other diploma programmes. The Branch prepares schedules

for valuation camps, Pass Board Meetings, and the appointment of Chairpersons, Boards of Examiners, and examiners for all programmes. It also schedules practical examinations, appoints examiners, prepares audit replies, DCB statements, and various reports, certifies TA bills, and handles other related miscellaneous work.

Examination Distance Education BCom Branch: deals with the conduct of examinations for candidates registered under the Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE), University of Calicut, for programmes such as B.Com, B.Com (Additional Specialisation), and B.B.A, along with all associated tabulation work. The Branch also prepares and issues Degree Certificates for candidates of these programmes. In addition, it oversees the monitoring and examination-related activities of 52 affiliated colleges conducting various B.A., B.Sc., B.Com., and B.B.A. programmes under the FYUGP from 2024 onwards.

Examination Distance Education BA Branch: deals with the conduct of examinations for candidates registered under the Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE), University of Calicut, for BA programmes along with all associated tabulation work. The Branch also prepares and issues Degree Certificates for candidates of these programmes. In addition, the monitoring and examination-related activities of affiliated colleges allotted under FYUGP are also carried out by this Branch.

Revaluation : processes applications for revaluation, scrutiny, and photocopy of answer scripts, coordinating with CEAM for script retrieval, verification, and false numbering. It conducts revaluation through camps or home valuation, finalises marks, and publishes results. The Branch also issues photocopies of answer scripts, maintains Revaluation Tabulation Registers, and manages all remuneration-related work for revaluation, including bill scrutiny, payments, and recoupment. In addition, it handles the Centralised Asset Management System and stock registers concerned, duty certificates for examiners, DCB preparation, and other general administrative tasks.

Tappal Section: receives all articles addressed to Pareeksha Bhavan from the Post Office, colleges, other institutions, and students, including those submitted by hand, and sorts them systematically. All tappals are entered in the relevant register and delivered without delay to the concerned branches. The Section also scans and forwards all currents to the respective branches of Pareeksha Bhavan through the DDFS immediately upon receipt.

Exam. Despatch Section: handles the despatch of all ordinary tappal articles of Pareeksha Bhavan after franking. It is also responsible for the despatch of all Speed Post articles originating from the various branches/sections of Pareekshabhavan. The Section manages DDFS files, including BNPL and franking machine records, and carries out the consolidation, verification, and certification of the monthly BNPL bills (Speed Post charges) of Pareeksha Bhavan before forwarding them to the P.I.D Branch.

Digital Wing-I: plays a key role in handling and processing online Genuineness Verification and authentication of certificates through the dedicated portal www.cudirectverify.in which has verified over 26,000 documents to date. The Section also transmits Genuineness Verification Reports and Official Transcripts to the World Education Services (WES) via the Quatrix platform. An official email ID, verify@uoc.ac.in has been established for issuing Genuineness Verification Reports, and applicants are advised to accept verification communications only from this address. The Section also manages establishment-related work of all units under the Digital Wing. As per instructions from the Digital Wing Printing Section, Digital Wing-I forwards official notes to the Exam Store for supplying blank grade cards needed for printing. It also maintains the Asset Register under the Centralised Asset Management System for all Digital Wing Sections and prepares and forwards attendance statements of regular staff, sheet rolls for CLR Peons, leave applications, and other related documents.

Digital Wing-II (Software Support Team): Software support for, (a) Principals, Administrative Staff and Faculties of Affiliated Colleges and University Departments. (b) Students. Identifying software requirements, planning and drafting requirements, supporting CUCC in developing phase of various programmes. Software Testing, Implementing, Training and identifying the threats in the existing software. Support service for University staff, College authorities through calls, e-mail, whatsapp etc., in the conduct of 3 - year, UG / PG including University departments, Integrated PG examinations and support for Centralized Valuation Camps. Intermediary service within CUCC Programmers and various branches of Pareeksha Bhavan. Scheduling meetings and training with CUCC Programmers when issues are identified from various branches. Conducting immediate training sessions for employees. Ongoing Projects: i. Online software for Genuineness Verification, Official Transcripts and Abstract of Academic Records. ii. Online Application, verification and issuance of certificates including Provisional Certificates and Consolidated Grade Cards, etc for Students Service Hub. Digitization- Receiving Tabulation Register from concerned sections, identifying pages to be scanned, forwarding to the firm selected for digitization, verifying the images scanned, receiving back Tabulation Register from the firm, and forwarding the same to the section concerned. Verifying the itemized invoices raised by the firm. Entries on respective registers and creating financial statements. Implementing retrieval software phase-by-phase. Training for employees on the retrieval software.

Digital Wing-III: This section is performing the duties related to the DigiLocker, NAD, Academic Bank of Credits (ABC). The University enabled the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC), a national-level facility that will allow students to

store the credits scored by them in a virtual/digital storehouse. ABC is an initiative proposed under the National Education Policy 2020. ABC ids (APAAR Id) are essential for all students in Credit and Semester Systems to enable transfer of academic credits between different education institutions and to ensure a smooth study mobility

Digital Wing Printing Section: The Printing Section of the Digital Wing is equipped with four Heavy Duty Riso Printers to meet the printing needs of Pareeksha Bhavan, which includes printing certificates/ various grade cards, tabulation registers, nominal rolls, etc., in a time-bound manner.

Hologram Section: was previously the central unit responsible for printing all degree certificates before the introduction of Digital Signatures for authentication. At present, the Section processes degree certificate applications of students who completed programmes under the 'year' pattern, as forwarded by the tabulation branches. The Section maintains extensive registers containing folio numbers of certificates issued, and is currently digitising this data through manual entry into the software. It also manages and safeguards the stock of high-security blank degree certificate cards used for printing degree certificates.

Pre-Degree Section: The section handles verification of applications, supporting documents, and chalan receipts for issuing various certificates, including Duplicate Mark Lists, Genuineness Reports, Pass Certificates, Official Transcripts, Name Corrections, Seal Affixations, and Bonafide Certificates of Pre-Degree course. The work involves searching and retrieving the relevant Tabulation Registers, preparing the DDFS Note File after verification with office records, and forwarding it for approval. Based on the approved note file, the section prepares hand-written Duplicate Mark Lists, affixes the Genuineness Stamp, prepares Pass Certificates and Bonafide Certificates, manually types Official Transcripts for endorsement by the Controller of Examinations and the Registrar, and carries out approved name corrections in original mark lists along with corresponding entries in the Tabulation Registers. Seal affixation in TC/SSLC books is also done as per request. All endorsed documents are finally handed over to the Despatch Section. The section also assists candidates in tracing Pre-Degree Register Numbers when needed.

CEAM: receives all answer scripts after the first valuation. The scripts are then sorted district-wise and stored in numbered units. When Revaluation Sections request scripts for revaluation, CEAM retrieves the required scripts from the respective trays and hands them over to the concerned sections. After the publication of revaluation results, all scripts related to that examination are removed from the CEAM trays on the 16th day.

Students Service Hub (SSH): provides comprehensive walk-in assistance for all examination-related services handled by Pareeksha Bhavan. This includes guiding students on procedures for obtaining Mark Lists, Grade Cards, Consolidated Mark Lists (CML), Consolidated Grade Cards (CGC), Provisional Certificates (PC), and Semester-wise Mark Lists/ Grade Cards (SWML/SWGC), all of which are currently processed offline. The SSH also supports students seeking services related to Revaluation, Duplicate Certificates/ Mark Lists, Course Cancellation/ Readmission, Degree Certificates, Official Transcript, Genuineness Verification, Condonation, Name Correction, Name change through Gazette notification, Grace marks, Special Supplementary Examination and all those matters sought by students seeking clarifications concerned with examination registrations of all programmes including Calicut University Four Year UG Programmes(CUFYUGP). Currently, the SSH has separate counters for PG, BA Regular, BA Distance, B Sc Regular, B.Com Regular, B.Com Distance, EPR, B.Tech and for issuance of CSS (Compulsory Social Service) Certification/ Grade Card. At SSH, students receive help and guidance with clarity on all the matters mentioned above ensuring that they are properly informed before any application procedure. The Student Service Hub also takes initiatives to streamline the various procedures related to various services rendered to the students by the Pareeksha Bhavan. At SSH, student visitors are provided with up-to-date information on notifications, result declarations, application acceptance periods and deadlines, certificate availability. Standard timelines and follow-up procedures are communicated to students clearly.

Major achievements of Pareeksha Bhavan during the Year 2025

Pareeksha Bhavan achieved significant progress in 2025 across examination management, result publication, student services, and administrative efficiency.

The Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP) examinations were conducted successfully.

The Graduation Ceremony 2025 for UG students was conducted smoothly for candidates from affiliated colleges and the Centre for Distance and Online Education, wherein original degree certificates were distributed within one month of result publication at selected colleges across four districts.

Duplicate consolidated grade cards were promptly issued to students who lost documents in the Fengal cyclone.

Pareekshabhavan branches ensured timely conduction and publication of a wide range of examinations under UG,PG, and FYUGP for candidates from affiliated colleges/ University Centres/University Departments and the Centre for Distance and Online Education- from One-Time Regular Supplementary exams of earlier admissions to all regular, supplementary, and improvement examinations maintaining strict timelines.

A major milestone in B.Tech was the record-time publication of VIII semester results, ahead of other universities.

Similarly, B.Arch final semester results were published swiftly. Work has begun to introduce Kerala's first Integrated B.Des + M.Des (Dual Degree) 5-year programme under the University of Calicut.

Several administrative and support sections made significant contributions. The Monitoring Section facilitated timely UG and PG result declarations, while the EX Section established a comprehensive Question Bank System. ECQ disbursed over ₹6.5 crore in examiner remuneration and launched online systems for bill submission and expenditure handling while clearing multiple audit objections. Exam Store-II improved logistical support and generated ₹48.39 lakh through the sale of waste paper, enabling the procurement of new vehicles.

The Revaluation Branch published the Sixth Semester UG revaluation results within 12 working days, a notable efficiency improvement.

The Student Service Hub (SSH) drove multiple reforms, including developing future-ready software for key certificates, standardising applications and procedures, improving tabulation software functionality, and introducing the Grace Mark Planner. These improvements reduced student queries, streamlined workflows, and enhanced student-centric services across Pareeksha Bhavan.

A. SYNDICATE PORTAL - PAPERLESS GOVERNANCE SYSTEM

In 2025, the University achieved a significant digital milestone with the implementation of the Syndicate Portal, developed to make Syndicate and its associated Standing committee meetings fully paperless. This is in line with the resolution of the Syndicate (Item No. 2024.1058, dated 31.08.2024) to transition to a digital meeting environment. The portal was indigenously developed by the University's own programmers under Calicut University Computer Centre (CUCC), using only internal resources and without purchasing any software from external sources. This makes the initiative both cost-effective and a testament to the University's in-house technical capabilities.

As part of implementation of the proposed system, to facilitate seamless digital functioning, tablet computers were issued to all Syndicate members and officers of the university, enabling them to view meeting notices, agendas, notes, reports, and other documents online. Different sections can now upload Syndicate and Standing Committee notes, check their current status, view meeting outcomes, download extracts and reports, and track the disposal and results of notes submitted all through online. Previously, a single Syndicate meeting required an enormous amount of paper. With the introduction of the syndicate portal, paper usage has been drastically reduced, significantly cutting down on both paper consumption and manual effort. This initiative has replaced the traditional paper-based conduct of meetings. New system has also improved the data accessibility, searchability, and workflow efficiency, also ensuring faster and more transparent processing.

The Out Patient Clinic of University Health Centre functions in two shifts on all week days except Sunday and Second Saturday (8.30 am to 1.30 pm & 1.30 pm to 6.30 pm). The University Health Centre imparts health care services: out-patient consultation, laboratory diagnosis and dispensing of prescribed medicines - for students, employees, pensioners and their dependents also the public belonging to BPL category from the nearest Grama Panchayath - Pallikkal, Tenhipalam and Chelembra fully free of cost.Laboratory services made available to the public at a discounted rate. Also started to collect Rs. 10/- as OP ticket fee from the public.

Highly sophisticated laboratory with most modern diagnostic equipments like Fully Automated Biochemical Analyzer (Bio-system), Fully Automated Hematology Analyzer (Swelab Alfa), Binocular Microscope, Fully Automated Hormone Analyzer, Specific Protein Analyzer (MISPA-i2 HbA1c Analyzer) etc is functioning in the Health Centre to ensure community service. It functions on all working days from 08.30 am to 01.30 pm to impart all kinds of routine diagnostic tests absolutely free of cost to University Community.

Almost all kinds of medicines including costly antibiotics and Cardiac drugs are dispensing from the Pharmacy on prescription, totally free of cost, to University Community and the public belonging to BPL category. Generic medicines are purchasing on rate contract basis and so high face value medicines can be purchased and dispensed within the budget allocation.

The directorate has been constituted to improve quality of teaching & research activities that are socially relevant and acceptable to the present and future needs of the society. It is aimed at to encourage faculty to take up industry projects and other consultancy projects. DOC will promote research, consultancy, training and development proposals in collaboration with industry.

Client can submit a request for availing consultancy to the Directorate of Consultancy which shall subsequently be forwarded to the concerned faculty member. The consultant will give an estimate amount after proper study and inform the client along with other terms and conditions. A MOU / MOA will be prepared between client and the University which will be verified by a committee constituted for it with Pro-Vice Chancellor as Chairman and Registrar as Convenor. The consultancy charge is shared between the consultant and the University in 70 : 30 ratio. University will share half of the University share to the department concerned for infrastructure development.

One agreement have been signed in this year with Department of Chemistry (Dr.A.I.Yahya) and Malabar Co-Optech

Dr. Anu Joseph, Associate Professor, Department of Biotechnology is continuing her consultancy with Comtrust Academy and some other proposals are under processing.

The Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development Centre (IEDC), funded by the Kerala Startup Mission (KSUM), serves as the university's primary platform for fostering a culture of creativity, problem-solving, and student entrepreneurship. Its core functions include promoting innovation through ideation activities, workshops, and competitions; enabling hands-on skill development and prototyping through maker spaces and labs; providing mentoring, pre-incubation support, and industry linkages for emerging student startups; and acting as the official channel connecting campus innovators to KSUM schemes, grants, and opportunities. The IEDC also supports community-focused innovation, encourages interdisciplinary collaboration, and ensures that promising ideas advance from concept to viable products or ventures, strengthening the university's innovation ecosystem.

In 2025, the IEDC, in collaboration with the Centre for Innovation and Entrepreneurship (CIE), conducted over 50 days of hands-on workshops and innovation programmes, benefiting more than two thousand participants from universities, colleges, schools, and the wider community. Key activities included STEM workshops, microcontroller and PCB training, 3D design and printing sessions, electronics and repair workshops, outreach events such as the Moon Day Celebration, and an advanced Drone/UAS Boot Camp. The IEDC and CIE are currently developing a University Problem Repository, followed by an Idea Competition and Startup Grant initiative to identify critical challenges and support the most promising ideas toward startup creation.

The Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development Centre (IEDC) promotes student innovation and entrepreneurship by conducting ideation activities, skill-development programmes, prototyping support, mentoring, pre-incubation guidance, and KSUM-linked initiatives that help convert ideas into viable products and startups.

Special Achievements during 2025 :

In 2025, the IEDC successfully conducted over 50 days of hands-on innovation and entrepreneurship programmes in collaboration with CIE—benefiting more than 2,000 students, faculty, and community members through STEM workshops, prototyping and fabrication training, electronics and repair sessions, 3D design and printing modules, PCB and micro controller training, outreach events like Moon Day Celebration, and an advanced Drone/UAS Boot Camp; the IEDC also initiated the development of a University Problem Repository and launched the upcoming Idea Competition and Startup Grant pipeline to nurture high-potential student innovations into viable startups..

3. Centre for Innovation & Entrepreneurship

Year of establishment : 2023

Brief details of the work :

The Centre for Innovation and Entrepreneurship (CIE), University of Calicut, is a dynamic hub dedicated to fostering creativity, technology adoption, and entrepreneurial development. Established in collaboration with Kerala Start-up Mission (KSUM), the Centre has grown into a vibrant ecosystem supporting students, researchers, farmers, fishermen, women-led groups, and aspiring entrepreneurs. With its state-of-the-art Fabrication Laboratory, dedicated training and skilling centre, and modern coworking space for incubatees, CIE provides the perfect environment for idea exploration, prototyping, and hands-on innovation. Regular workshops, Idea Competitions, mentoring sessions, and

technology- transfer initiatives ensure that emerging technologies and entrepreneurial opportunities are accessible to all, effectively bridging academic knowledge with real-world needs.

CIE continues to expand its impact by strengthening partnerships with industries, government bodies, and community organisations. The Centre provides pre-incubation and incubation support, facilitates product development, and enables collaborations that accelerate research commercialisation and startup formation. Through innovation bootcamps, interdisciplinary hackathons, community outreach programmes, and continuous skill-building activities, CIE promotes a culture of innovation that extends far beyond the campus. Guided by a vision of inclusive growth and long-term sustainability, CIE empowers individuals and communities to transform ideas into market-ready solutions and drive the innovation-led development of Kerala.

CIE undertakes activities including innovation support, skill development, prototyping through its fabrication lab, incubation services, idea competitions, training programmes, and industry- linked initiatives to promote technology-driven entrepreneurship and community development.

Special Achievements during 2025 :

In 2025, the CIE conducted 62 days of hands-on workshops and innovation programmes across Kerala, benefiting more than two thousand participants—including university students and researchers, college and school students, and technology enthusiasts from the community. The Centre delivered a diverse range of programmes such as STEM innovation workshops, microcontroller training, 3D designing and printing sessions, basic electronics and soldering workshops, LED repairing and reuse training, PCB design and electronic product development sessions, large-scale outreach events like Moon Day Celebration, and an advanced five- day Drone/UAS Boot Camp. We are now developing a university-focused Problem Repository, followed by an Idea Competition and Startup Grant initiative to identify campus challenges, inspire innovative solutions, and support the most promising ideas in transforming into viable startups.

4. Interuniversity Centre for Plant Biotechnology

Name of the Director : Dr. A Yusuf

Year of establishment : 2009

Brief details of the work :

Interuniversity Centre for Plant Biotechnology was established at the University of Calicut in 2009, utilizing the one-time financial assistance of Rs. 2.3 crores from the Higher Education Department, Govt. of Kerala. The centre was inaugurated on 05.10.2009 by Mr. M.A. Baby, the then Hon'ble Minister of Education, Govt. of Kerala. The centre is concentrating on emerging areas of plant biotechnology including Plant tissue culture, molecular phylogeny and plant genomics. The centre along with the R&D activities is providing internships to students from various colleges/ Universities to help them to acquire research skills and also to submit M.Sc. Dissertations during their course of study.

Special achievements during the year 2025 :

The centre has started a Project mode Diploma course in Commercial Tissue culture of Agri- Horticulture Crops to the Higher Education Council, Government of Kerala. The students admitted to the course are given hands-on training on commercial tissue culture and propagation methods

The Centre has started a new project on the commercialisation of tissue culture protocols for agri horticultural crops intending to earn revenue for the Centre by selling the tissue culture-raised plants to the farmers. Tissue culture-raised plants are supplied to farmers along with technical support to generate revenue for the centre.

5. Central Sophisticated Instrumentation Facility (CSIF)

Name of the Director : Dr. Zuhail K P, Asst. Professor, Dept. of Physics

Year of establishment : 2016

Brief details of the work :

Central Sophisticated Instrumentation Facility (CSIF) currently houses 18 sophisticated instruments used for materials characterization, different physical and chemical analysis. CSIF also has a High Performance Computation Facility which is used for computational analysis of various domains. These instruments and facilities help the research community to carry out globally competitive research in cutting-edge areas of basic and applied sciences. Analysis of numerous samples submitted by the research scholars from various institutions (including the teaching departments of the University of Calicut) are carried out using the sophisticated instruments placed at CSIF and the results are provided to the applicants concerned for further usage in their research related activities. CSIF serves as a central facility supporting the activities of the research group. CSIF offers training to University students in sample analysis methodology using the sophisticated instruments. CSIF is also planning to conduct large scale training programmes and workshops for the research scholars from various institutions to familiarize them with sample analysis techniques using the wide range of instruments placed at CSIF.

Special achievements during the year 2025 :

CSIF has conducted training sessions on various instruments for research scholars. More than 5,000 samples received from research scholars of the University teaching departments, affiliated colleges, other academic institutions, R&D laboratories/institutes, and industries have been analyzed based on their requirements, and the results have been provided for further use. Students from various schools and colleges have also visited CSIF to understand and familiarize themselves with the sophisticated instruments installed at the facility.

6. Centre for Photonics

Name of the Director : Dr Libu K. Alexander

Year of establishment : 2023

Brief details of the work :

- i. Activities to launch a course on photonics are underway. For this purpose, a board of studies is now constituted. Attempts to hire a contract faculty to facilitate the centre launch are attempted.
- ii. Purchased an equipment – Fluorescence spectrometer at the centre using SPG funds

Four research papers with commendable impact factors were published in the address of the centre for Photonics.

7. CDMRP- Community Disability Management and Rehabilitation Programme

Name of the Director : Prof. (Dr.) Baby Shari P.A.

Year of establishment : 2015

Brief details of the work :

Community-based Disability Management and Rehabilitation Programme (CDMRP) is a joint project of University of Calicut with the financial support of Social Justice Department, Government of Kerala. The Advanced Disability Management Clinic of CDMRP functions in the Department of Psychology, University of Calicut and 10 Community based disability management clinics are established in Malappuram, Kozhikode and Kannur districts of Kerala. This project provides a comprehensive, evident based disability management services through community approach which facilitate recover, empowerment, equal opportunities and full participation of person with disability and their families. This project also acts as authentic platform to training of human resources to fulfill current and potential

requirement in the areas of disability and rehabilitation. This project helps to create a new social order which facilitate an inclusive model for empowering the persons with disabilities. This project is a first of its kind in Kerala and a comprehensive blend of Community based disability management, recovery oriented Rehabilitation and need based research and human resource development, which will be a replicable model and strategies of sustainable transformation of the persons with disabilities from all sector of community. United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) has provisionally approved the CDMRP as UNESCO chair for Community-based Disability Management Rehabilitation Studies. This UNESCO Chair is the first is kind in the world. CDMRP is considered as one of the best practices of the University of Calicut.

Activities of CDMRP

1. Clinical Services (CDMC)

We conduct regular free disability management clinic in community setting in collaboration and coordination with Local self Govt. bodies, NGOs, and community volunteers. CDMRP is functions in a multi-disciplinary approach with Psychologists, Speech Language Pathologist and Audiologists, Physiotherapists, Occupational Therapists and Special Educators. Around 14,700 beneficiaries with Neuro-developmental or Developmental disorders have registered under CDMRP for various therapy and assessment services. Around 60-80 therapy beneficiaries receives therapy from various clinics of CDMRP daily.

2. Training Programme

Disability management training programs would use capacity-building strategies to strengthen the capability of service providers/professionals; communities and addresses the unique needs of individuals with developmental disabilities and their families. Various need-based training modules would be developed through the consultation expert from national and international agencies related disability and rehabilitation. CDMRP have organized 1000+ Training Programmes both online and offline benefiting around 8000 Parents/ Caretakers, Community volunteers (Asha workers, Anganwadi Teachers), Rehabilitation Professionals, Policy Makers Etc.

3. Professional Courses

To create a cadre of Rehabilitation Psychologist, CDMRP provides intensive training for Post Graduate Diploma in Rehabilitation Psychology (PGDRP, approved by RCI) students of Dept, of Psychology in the area of Children with Neuro-developmental disorder, Developmental delay and other issues. This strengthens the field with qualified Rehabilitation Psychologist. 50+ Students have completed PGDRP course – Clinical posting in CDMRP. Also in order to strengthen the field CDMRP provides internship and hands-on training to students from various institutes, CDMRP

Provided 200+ internship for students from various Disciplines, within CDMRP's area of work.

4. **DISABILITY AND REHABILITATION RESEARCH CELL (DRRC)**

Disability and Rehabilitation Research Cell would conduct, support and promote researches that explore the psycho-social, economic, political, public policy, dimensions of inclusion and equality of children with disabilities. A Guideline for parents of Children with Disabilities (Life in the times of COVID-19) for the better care of children with disabilities during lockdown has been officially approved by UNESCO. This handbook for parents of children with disabilities has been published by UNESCO. This booklet has been translated into Spanish, Russian, Nepali, Spanish sign language and four Indian local languages. (Ref.: <https://en.unesco.org/news/another-covid-19-front-line-parents-children-disabilities>) CDMRP also undertakes various need-based research projects in the area of developmental disabilities, Vocational training for YAID, Adolescent – life skills, Menstrual hygiene. Publications – Current Trends In The Management of Developmental Disabilities, India, Book published by University of Calicut (ISBN- 978-81-933096-2-9.) July 2026.

3. Brief details of work:

The Campus Landscaping division have been actively engaged in the planting activities, landscaping, and maintenance of gardens at Guest Houses, Seminar Complex, Park, Hostels, Administration building premises, Vice-

Chancellor's and Pro-Vice-Chancellor's bungalows, Tagore Nikethan, CHMK Library, Manuscript library, CEAM, Triguna Sen Arena, and other small areas. Besides, this division also assists gardening activities of various departments of the University by way of providing planting materials, garden implements and technical information. This division also takes up the responsibility of decorating the premises of the venues for various functions organized by the University.

University Park

The Calicut University Park have been extensively used by the staff and students of this campus and visitors from outside since its opening in 1999. The lush green and pristine surroundings, well maintained topiaries and the Arachis yellow carpets and lawns are the major source of attraction. Besides, the park holds a very good collection of begonias and different kinds of foliage plants. Benches were provided for the visitors to relax, drinking water facility and play equipment for children's to play in the designated area in the park.

5. Activities:

1. A new area in front of the Administration block where the foundation stone of the University lies were developed into beautiful area, named as "Triguna Sen Arena" where staff and students can gather and relax during free time.
2. A nursery area in the Park was developed and a number of saplings were raised in view of the forthcoming Garden exhibition at the Botanical garden
3. More than 800 tree saplings were planted successfully in the University in association with the support from the Thenhipalam Grama Panchayath during this monsoon.
4. Over 600 saplings of Ixora plants (dwarf) were planted along the 750 m stretch of divider starting from the main avenue to the students trap.
5. The infestation of African snails in the University Campus was brought under control by effective application of molluscicides and manual picking.
6. A trailer was attached to the power tiller for the transportation of plant waste for composting.
7. Students from the neighbouring schools are regularly visiting the University Park during working days. Their entry is regulated by providing entry pass to each school on priority basis.
8. Other routine activities, propagation of ornamental foliage plants and avenue trees for further planting in the University Campus, general maintenance works including weed control, topiary of hedges and shrubs in the University Park, gardens at Guest Houses, administration building premises, seminar complex; manuring, watering and ploughing and mulching at the end of monsoon.
9. Disease and pest control measures throughout the year.
10. Efforts are being taken to enrich the collection at the University Park in collaboration with the University Botanical Garden.

Brief Details of Work :

The Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) Cell functions as the central institutional body for promoting, protecting, and managing the intellectual output of the University. Its major activities include creating awareness on patents, copyrights, trademarks, and related forms of intellectual property through the organisation of seminars, workshops, and training programmes for faculty members, research scholars, and students.

The IPR Cell guides inventors in the submission of invention disclosures and provides support for prior-art searches, patentability assessments, and the drafting of patent applications. It facilitates the filing, prosecution, and processing of patent applications, and maintains comprehensive records of intellectual property filed, granted, and commercialised.

The Cell also develops and recommends the institutional IPR Policy, covering aspects such as intellectual property ownership, revenue sharing, licensing mechanisms, and inventor rights. Strengthening collaboration with government agencies, patent attorneys, incubation centres, and industry partners constitutes another key responsibility.

Further, the IPR Cell promotes a strong culture of innovation and entrepreneurship by coordinating mentorship programmes, pitching events, and IP clinics for innovators. Overall, the IPR Cell serves as a comprehensive support system that enables the University community to protect, manage, and translate research outcomes into meaningful societal and economic benefits.

Special achievement during the year 2025 :

During the reporting period, the IPR Cell achieved significant progress in strengthening intellectual property-related activities within the University. An Intellectual Property Awareness Seminar was successfully conducted on 5 December 2025, benefiting faculty members and research scholars by enhancing their understanding of patenting procedures and copyright-related issues.

During the year, one patent was granted. In addition, six patent prior-art searches were completed to support researchers in assessing novelty and patentability. Two patent applications were filed, and two Invention Disclosure Forms (IDFs) were forwarded to CUSAT for further processing.

Further, a specialised tool for detecting copyrightable content was developed by the IPR Associate for the Education Department, University of Calicut contributing to improved protection and management of academic materials. Overall, the IPR Cell continued to foster a culture of innovation and provided structured, end-to-end support for intellectual property activities across the University.
